

NATIONAL POPPY DAY IS FRIDAY

THE AMERICAN LEGION MAY 21, 2024

The Friday before Memorial Day is National Poppy Day. The red poppy is a nationally recognized symbol of sacrifice worn by Americans since World War I to honor those who served and died for our country in all wars. It reminds Americans of the sacrifices made by our veterans while protecting our freedoms.

On Sept. 27, 1920, the poppy became the official flower of the American Legion Family, led largely by the American Legion Auxiliary, to memorialize the soldiers who fought and died during the war. In 1924, the distribution of poppies became a national program of The American Legion.

American Legion Family members will be distributing the symbolic flower on National Poppy Day, which falls on May 24 this year, and everyone is encouraged to wear a red poppy to honor military sacrifices. Watch a message from American Legion National Commander Daniel Seehafer and Auxiliary President Lisa Williamson about the importance of wearing a red poppy to remember the fallen.

Thanks to the LEGION Act (Let Everyone Get Involved In Opportunities for National Service Act), Congress expanded the current eligibility period to cover Dec. 7, 1941, to the present, and includes the current war campaigns. Previously, there were seven declared war periods. Now there are two, the current war period dating back to World War II and another war era covering World War I. No other restrictions to American Legion membership changed

VA TO GRANT 1 MILLIONTH BENEFIT CLAIM FOR VETERANS AND THEIR SURVIVORS UNDER THE PACT ACT

THE AMERICAN LEGION MAY 21, 2024

Today, the Department of Veterans Affairs expects to grant its 1 millionth PACT Act-related disability compensation claims to veterans and survivors since President Biden signed the bill into law on Aug. 10, 2022. The grant rate for these claims is 75% – a sharp increase from pre-PACT levels – and VA has delivered more than \$5.7 billion in earned benefits to those veterans and survivors.

The PACT Act expanded VA health care and benefits to millions of veterans, including adding "presumptive" service connection for hundreds of conditions linked to burn pits, agent orange, and other hazards while serving our country. Presumptions such as these lower the burden of proof required to receive disability benefits, helping veterans get the benefits they deserve as quickly as possible. The average service connection rate for veterans with these granted claims is 70%, meaning that they receive more than \$20,000 in earned benefits payments from VA each year.

"Thanks to the PACT Act, VA is delivering more benefits to more veterans than ever before," said Under Secretary for Benefits Joshua Jacobs. "We encourage all toxic-exposed veterans and their survivors to apply today for care and benefits at VA.gov/PACT. When you apply, we will stop at nothing to get you the benefits you've earned."

Through the PACT Act, VA has been able to help millions of veterans get the health care and benefits they deserve. Key impacts include:

- More veterans are enrolling in health care: More than 400,000 veterans have enrolled in VA health care over the past year, a 30% increase year-over-year. This is critical because veterans who come to VA are proven to have better or equal health outcomes, higher satisfaction scores, and trust VA outpatient care at 91.8%.
- More than 5.4 million veterans have been screened by VA for toxic exposures: These screenings are a critical step to detecting, understanding, and treating potentially life-threatening health conditions. Of the 5.4 million veterans who have received the screening, 44% reported at least one potential exposure.
- Veterans are applying for benefits at all-time record rates: Thanks to the largest outreach campaign in VA history, veterans and survivors submitted 2,433,729 claims applications in 2023 an all-time record and 39% more than in 2022. Veterans and survivors are on pace to break this record again in 2024.
- Veterans exposed to toxins and other environmental hazards are now eligible for VA health care: In March, as directed by President Biden, VA announced that all veterans who meet eligibility requirements and were exposed to toxins and other hazards while serving in the military at home or abroad had become eligible to enroll directly in VA health care. This expansion eliminated the phased-in approach called for by the PACT Act meaning that millions of veterans are becoming eligible for VA health care up to eight years earlier than written into law.

The 1 million granted PACT Act-related claims are claims from more than 888,000 veterans and survivors that included a PACT Act condition where at least one condition from the claim was granted, regardless of whether the granted condition is one of the PACT-specific conditions noted above. In total, VA has received 1.65 million PACT Act-related claims and completed more than 1.32 million since August 2022. More information and data on the impact of the PACT Act can be found in VA's biweekly <u>PACT Act Dashboard</u>.

VA is currently processing veteran benefits claims at the <u>fastest rate in history</u>, delivering more benefits, more quickly, to more veterans than ever before. As a result of this record pace, veteran claims pending over 125 days – known as the backlog – has decreased by more than 100,000 claims since December. Moving forward, VA will continue to aggressively reach out to veterans to encourage them to come to VA. VA encourages all veterans, family members, caregivers, and survivors to <u>learn more about VA</u> and apply for their world-class <u>health care</u> and <u>earned benefits</u> today.

Scammers are tricking Android users into installing a fake antivirus app that's actually malware — how to stay safe

A new <u>Android malware</u> campaign is using <u>social</u> <u>engineering</u> and several other tricks to dupe unsuspecting users into installing malware capable of draining their bank accounts.

As reported by <u>BleepingComputer</u>, this particular campaign only affects users of the <u>best Android phones</u> in Finland at the moment. However, it's still a great example of the types of tactics and means hackers use to trick people into installing <u>malicious apps</u>.

According to Finland's Transport and Communications Agency (<u>Traficom</u>), this attack begins with a text message that instructs the recipient to call a phone number. When they do, they are then instructed by a scammer on the other end to install a McAfee app for protection.

While you should never install any app someone coerces you to over the phone, the initial text messages in this campaign appeared to come from either banks or payment service providers using spoofing technology.

Here's everything you need to know about this new malware campaign and how you can avoid falling victim to it and others like it.

Sideloading Malware

Instead of coming from the <u>Google Play Store</u> or another official app store, this fake McAfee app arrives as an Android APK file which needs to be <u>sideloaded</u> onto a victim's phone. This is a major red flag and a clear giveaway that this is a scam as no bank or financial service provider would ever ask its customers to sideload an app.

Still though, many finish users have fallen for this scam with Traficom reporting that one victim lost over \$100,000. In fact, this scam has gotten so bad that the financial service provider OP Financial Group published a separate alert on its website warning its customers about text messages impersonating banks or national authorities.

While the Finnish authorities didn't name the malware strain being used in this campaign, BleepingComptuter noticed that it resembled a recent <u>Vultur banking trojan</u> campaign from the beginning of this year.

This new Vultur variant uses a combination of smishing (phishing over SMS) and phone call attacks to convince potential victims to download a fake McAFee Security app. Sound familiar? It should as this is almost the exact same attack scenario used in this new campaign.

For those who may have accidentally installed this malicious app posing as McAFee, you should call your bank immediately to enable protection measures and restore your compromised Android phone to its factory settings. You will lose your apps and other data but doing so will wipe the malware from your phone.

How to Stay Safe From Android Malware

Android malware has the potential to completely upend your life if you're not careful. This is why you want to be extremely cautious when installing any new app onto your smartphone.

Besides not sideloading apps, you also want to check the ratings and reviews of any app you download from the Google Play Store or other official Android app stores like the Samsung Galaxy Store or Amazon Appstore for that matter. Since reviews and ratings can be faked, I always recommend that you also look for video reviews so that you can see the app in question in action before installing it.


When you do install a new app, pay careful attention to the permissions it requests. Malicious apps spreading malware often request access to <u>unnecessary permissions</u> as a means to gain access over your phone. For instance, a simple utility app like a calculator doesn't need access to your photos or the ability to see your contacts. As for which permissions are an immediate red flag, <u>Accessibility Services</u> is a permission that's often abused by malicious apps as it gives the hackers behind them near total control of your phone.

As it comes pre-installed on most Android phones, you also want to make sure that <u>Google Play Protect</u> is enabled as it scans all of your existing apps and any new ones you download for malware. For extra protection though, you might also want to consider installing one of the <u>best Android antivirus apps</u> as they often come with additional security features like a <u>VPN</u> or <u>password manager</u>.


Scammers and hackers are going to keep coming up with clever new ways to infect users with malware as companies like Google and law enforcement agencies grow wise to their tricks. As such, it's up to you to be careful online and not let your emotions get the best of you when dealing with text messages or other communications sent from unknown senders or even people posing as someone they're not.


