



### EMBER'S PAWS OF HOPE



#### EMBER'S PAWS OF HOPE:

A nonprofit organization dedicated to providing emotional and mental support to veterans and first responders through the use of future certified therapy dog(s). Members of our team have a diverse background which include being trained in critical incident stress management and peer support, and we visit fire

stations, police stations, hospitals, and veterans facilities to offer comfort and companionship to those who serve our communities.

#### THE ANGEL:

Ember was 9 weeks old when she moved in with Tim Nickels, the goal was to have Ember become a therapy dog. It was discovered that Ember was too attached to Tim but no one knew that would save him later on. Anytime Tim was having a hard day or a bad shift Ember would sit with Tim. Tim was diagnosed with PTSD in 2020, Ember wouldn't leave his side. Ember knew something was up. Tim became suicidal and made attempts to end his life. Ember stopped him at least three times. When the days were dark, Ember wouldn't let him leave without her.



**THE PROJECT:** National American Legion asks Departments to partner with local organizations to support BE THE ONE. Commander McKenzie has chosen to partner with Ember's Paws of Hope (EPOH), an organization committed to provide, comfort, support, and emotional healing to veterans and first responders through the unconditional love and companionship of therapy dog. EPOH is dedicated to enhancing the wellbeing of those who serve our communities and country, offering a source of solace in times of stress, trauma and hardship.

**THE PLAN:** We are asking all American Legion Posts and/or members to financially contribute to Ember's Paws of Hope. This new 501-c-3 needs funding to provide more trained therapy dogs and make more appearances to provide physical, emotional and social well-being to others in need.

# How to Use MyLegion.org

## Help With Account Registration

### BEFORE YOU REGISTER PLEASE READ

Register using the email on your membership record. Registering with a different email will not include membership details or officer/committee activity.

**Do not register with a post, squadron, county, or district account. All MyLegion accounts are individual member accounts. Access to post and squadron membership management and online membership processing, reports and rosters are provided to members that hold an Adjutant or Commander position.**

**Do not share e-mails.** Only one email can be registered. The same email on multiple records will allow only one registration. Other accounts with the same email will not be allowed to register.

To update or verify the email on your membership record contact your department headquarters.

### Register a New Account

Go to [myLegion.org](https://mylegion.org) and select "Register"

Enter email in the [Register window](#) and click "Next". Register with the email address on your membership record. Registering with an email other than the one on your membership number will not include membership details or officer/committee activity.

Mobile No (Optional) – no functions at this time. Future enhancement.

Two-Factor Authentication –not recommended unless you wish to add extra security each time you log in. Setting two-factor authentication requires the password and a security code emailed with each log in.

Enter your Last Name, First Name and check consents and click "Next". [View](#)

Create your password in the [welcome window](#). - The email entered must be verified. The email is verified one of two ways.

Enter the OTP [sent to your email](#) and click "Finish Registration". This is sent after step 2.

Do not enter OTP and click "Finish Registration". [An email will be sent](#) with a link to confirm and returns to the login page.

Click My Account from your myLegion home page view your membership information. Officers registering for post and squadron access will find that information on the My Account window.

### **Mylegion.org Membership Processing/Group Permission Instructions**

#### **ASSIGN GROUP PERMISSION**

Home > My Views>Assign Group Permissions

1. Log into MyLegion and go to My Account.
2. Select group from MyGroups menu to access Group Profile
3. Go to "View Members"
4. Search the member to assign permission and click on their name to open member profile.
5. From the member's profile, select "Assign Group Permissions" from left MY VIEWS panel.
6. Select "Edit" in Management Settings

Check permissions to grant and "Save" Online Group Manager. This is the minimum permission requirement. It provides access view members and a quick link to member email addresses. Selecting this option only results in view only access and records cannot be updated. It also provides access to online membership tools in View Members — Global Member Search –Group Attributes - Reports/Labels – and Officer Materials.

Edit Individual Profile. Check Edit Individual Profile to grant authority edit member information.

Edit Group Profile. Adds the My View menu while in Group Profile.

Register or order for a group. Allows member to process online membership. Add, transfer, and add new members.

# MILITARY TRIVIA

A. "Fort Blunder" is the popular nickname for Fort Montgomery, an unfinished U.S. Fort near Rouses Point, NY, built after the War of 1812 to defend against British Canada, but construction halted when a surveying error revealed it was mistakenly built north of the border, on Canadian soil. The unfinished fort became a national embarrassment, with materials scavenged by locals, and the site became a historical curiosity symbolizing a major blunder, later replaced by a smaller Fort Montgomery built correctly further south after border negotiations.





# LEGION FAMILY MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

## American Legion

You must have served at least one day of active military duty since December 7, 1941, and have an honorable discharge or be currently serving honorably. This includes all U.S. military members who have served during a qualifying period, such as World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam, or current campaigns. The LEGION Act of 2019 expanded eligibility to include anyone who served since December 7, 1941, not just during designated war eras.

Eligible military branches:

- U.S. Army
- U.S. Navy
- U.S. Air Force
- U.S. Marine Corps
- U.S. Coast Guard
- U.S. Merchant Marine (eligible only from December 7, 1941, to December 31, 1946)
- National Guard/Reserves (all basic training and occupational training schools were considered federal active-duty service)

Eligibility for membership is open to individuals who have served at least one day of federal active duty since December 7, 1941, and were honorably discharged or are still serving honorably.

## Sons of The American Legion

All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons *of members of The American Legion*, and such male descendants of veterans *who died in service* during the period of April 6, 1917, through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service, shall be eligible for membership in the Sons of The American Legion.

## American Legion Auxiliary

Membership in The American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the:

- (1) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of members of The American Legion; and
- (2) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who served in either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918 and any time after December 7, 1941 who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge;
- (3) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918; and any time after December 7, 1941 who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge; and
- (4) to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion. \*

\* A woman who is eligible for American Legion membership is eligible to join the American Legion Auxiliary regardless of whether or not she is a member of The American Legion. However, eligibility of her female relatives (sister, mother, direct descendants) and/or spouse depends upon her membership in The American Legion.
