Mission Working Dogs

Their MISSION: To improve the lives of their community members who are living with a disability by providing them with properly trained service dogs to help them live more independently despite a physical disability and by providing therapy dogs which will bring mental well-being to the people of Maine such as those in nursing homes, hospitals, and schools.

Their VISION: At Mission Working Dogs, we train purpose-bred dogs to aid individuals with disabilities so that the handler can live a life to the fullest and more independently.

Their GOAL: Service dogs can assist those with physical disabilities such as mobility impairments by fetching dropped items, opening doors, and turning on and off lights. They can also help individuals with PTSD by learning to recognize an increase in anxiety, carrying medications, and providing deep pressure therapy to calm or redirect the handler. Dogs working as facility dogs are often trained to recognize a patient's affected side in the case of a stroke and to approach on the side the patient is able to pet with or throw the ball. Patients are able to work on fine motor movements in petting or caring for the dog as well as gross motor skills playing fetch with a dog that's able to bring the ball exactly to where the patient needs, such as on a side table or directly into their hand, rather than on the ground or trying to play tug with it inappropriately.

Their PLAN: Service dogs are generally trained for approximately two years and undergo a wide range of assessments on their physical health, temperament, and tasks or skills to make sure they can properly support their handler throughout life.

Can You Spot Al-Generated Images?

<u>Take Our Quiz to Test Your Skills!</u> Determining whether or not an image was created by generative AI is harder than ever, but it's still possible if you look out for these telltale signs.

One of the first signs that we could no longer believe our own eyes was when we spotted the pope sporting an oversized puffer. Al images have quickly evolved from laughably bizarre to frighteningly believable, and there are big consequences to not being able to tell authentically created images from those generated by artificial intelligence.

Al tools to create images—those images you can conjure in your mind but not necessarily execute through traditional media such as photography and painting—are easily accessible and either free or low-cost. OpenAl's Dall-E 3, Google Gemini, Stable Diffusion, Midjourney, Adobe Firefly, Craiyon, and others create credible-looking images that can fool at first glance, and likely even second and third ones.

These text-to-image generators work in a matter of seconds, but the damage they can do is lasting, from political propaganda to deepfake porn. Al is getting better and better at being undetectable. The industry's promises of watermarking to identify Al-generated images haven't come through, and likely wouldn't work in most cases anyway. But there are steps you can take to evaluate images and increase the likelihood that you won't be fooled by a robot.

The methods set out here are not foolproof, but they'll sharpen your instincts for detecting when AI's at work.

Flip It and Reverse It

If the image in question is newsworthy, <u>perform a reverse</u> <u>image search</u> to try to determine its source. Even—make that especially—if a photo is circulating on social media, that does not mean it's legitimate. If you can't find it on a respected news site and yet it seems groundbreaking, then the chances are strong that it's manufactured.

Take the Great Cascadia earthquake of 2001: It never happened, but once images of the imaginary event escaped a Midjourney subreddit, the event became real for those who never investigated further. The devastation of the Pacific Northwest that's depicted in the series—collapsed roadways, rescue workers, panicked people on their phones—forms a cohesive narrative that can easily go unchallenged.

A reverse image search uncovers the truth, but even then, you need to dig deeper. One "photo" with the caption "Amateur video captures the aftermath of the tsunami in Kodiak, AK" that we ran through Google's image search returns a story from NBC News with a snippet of a familiar-looking image and the headline "Floods Ravage Western Canada" in the results. A quick glance seems to confirm that the event is real, but one click reveals that Midjourney "borrowed" the work of a photojournalist to create something similar.

Hunt for Artifacts

Because artificial intelligence is piecing together its creations from the original work of others, it can show some inconsistencies close up. When you examine an image for signs of AI, zoom in as much as possible on every part of it. Stray pixels, odd outlines, and misplaced shapes will be easier to see this way.

Taking in the whole of this image of a museum filled with people that we created with Stability AI, you see a busy weekend day of culture for the crowd. But get closer to that crowd and you can see that each individual person is a pastiche of parts of people the AI was trained on.

Smooth Operator

Al doesn't generally do well with pores or other imperfections. If things seem too perfect to be real in an image, there's a chance they aren't real. In a filtered online world, it's hard to discern...
