EMBER'S PAWS OF HOPE



EMBER'S **PAWS** OF **HOPE:** A nonprofit organization dedicated to providing emotional and mental support to veterans and first responders through the use of future certified therapy dog(s). Members of our team have a diverse background which include being trained in critical incident stress management and peer support, and we visit fire

stations, police stations, hospitals, and veterans facilities to offer comfort and companionship to those who serve our communities.

THE ANGEL: Ember was 9 weeks old when she moved in with Tim Nickels, the goal was to have Ember become a therapy dog. It was discovered that Ember was too attached to Tim but no one knew that would save him later on. Anytime Tim was having a hard day or a bad shift Ember would sit with Tim. Tim was



diagnosed with PTSD in 2020, Ember wouldn't leave his side. Ember knew something was up. Tim became suicidal and made attempts to end his life. Ember stopped him at least three times. When the days were dark, Ember wouldn't let him leave without her.

THE PROJECT: National American Legion asks Departments to partner with local organizations to support BE THE ONE. Commander McKenzie has chosen to partner with Ember's Paws of Hope (EPOH), an organization committed to provide, comfort, support, and emotional healing to veterans and first responders through the unconditional love and companionship of therapy dog. EPOH is dedicated to enhancing the wellbeing of those who serve our communities and country, offering a source of solace in times of stress, trauma and hardship.

"A Century of Excellence"

National Commander LaCoursiere reflects on American Legion Baseball's 100 years of citizenship through sportsmanship.

↑ hen CC Sabathia and the late Dick Allen are inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame on July 27, they will join 87 other American Legion Baseball alumni who have



earned the game's ultimate honor.

No one should be surprised. As another Legion Baseball alumnus, Justin Verlander, once said, "If you expect greatness, greatness shouldn't surprise you."

For 100 years now, American Legion Baseball hasn't just produced great players - it has produced great citizens. Introduced at the South Dakota American Legion Convention on July 17, 1925, it had more than 52,000 players less than a year later. By 1947, Babe Ruth would serve as a national spokesman, and the number of players soon topped 1 million.

Legion Baseball produced legends like Yogi Berra, who served on D-Day while in the Navy. It produced heroes like Ted Williams, who twice interrupted his phenomenal baseball career to serve as a fighter pilot in World War II and Korea. It produced minor league pitchers like Donny Tidwell, who after winning a championship with the Ogden Dodgers volunteered for Vietnam, where he was killed in action.

The overwhelming majority of American Legion Baseball players will never play the game at a professional level. But they adhere to a code of sportsmanship that enhances not just their own life skills but those around them. Each player pledges to keep the rules; keep faith with teammates; keep (my) temper; keep fit; keep a stout heart in defeat; keep (my) pride under in victory; and finally, to keep a sound soul, a clean mind and a healthy body.

More than 10 million young people have played American Legion Baseball during its first century. More than 3,000 teams compete today in all 50 states, Puerto Rico and parts of Canada. The American Legion World Series has a permanent home in Shelby, N.C., and its games are televised on ESPN.

Charlie Manuel, who managed the Philadelphia Phillies to the World Series in 2008, spoke for many Legion Baseball alumni recently when he said, "I think everybody should play American Legion Baseball."

Judging by its history and its numbers, millions would agree.

Standard Operating Procedures From The Post Adjutant's Guide & MyLegion.org Instructions

Post Adjutants Guide: SECTION III – REPORTS

- Consolidated Post Reports (CPR)
- Annual Post Data Report
- Post Officer Certification

Consolidated Post Report (CPR) form

The Consolidated Post Report (CPR) was established in 1975 to assist departments in the documentation of the various activities a specific post has done during the 12-month reporting period, June 1 through May 31. The CPR may be the most important document the post will complete all year. Updates can be made to the CPR throughout the year and saved on MyLegion.org. When the report is complete, click "Submit" and print a copy for the post records.

A paper or hard copy of the CPR may be sent to each post from department headquarters requesting data on the post's programs and activities. Submitted reports are included in a final report presented to Congress each year by the national commander as justification for The American Legion's nonprofit status and to elaborate on what the organization does in local communities. The deadline for department submission of the CPR to National Headquarters is July 1. Check with the department for its submission date. The CPR form may also be completed on MyLegion.org (see page 24 of Post Adjutants Guide) and is available for download as a fillable PDF at legion.org/publications under "Officers Manuals & Documents." Completed hard copy forms may be submitted to the department and/or mailed to The American Legion, Attn: IT/Member Support Services, P.O. Box 1954, Indianapolis, IN 46206. Digital copies may be emailed to the department and/or sent to CPRandCSRforms@legion.org.

If the post had projects, activities or events that cannot be adequately covered on the report form, attach a written description with pictures and articles. The narrative report will be reviewed by personnel at National Headquarters. Each post has a story to tell, and when we speak collectively the message of our story is magnified.

Annual Post Data Report

Throughout the year, national staff will contact posts regarding membership renewals, awards, Dispatch issues and other subscriptions, veterans important information. In February, the Annual Post Data Report is mailed to department headquarters for distribution to posts. Each form is pre-printed with current contact information from National Headquarters' data system. This pre-printed form for the post is sent for annual spring reporting. When there is a change, notify department headquarters, which will forward the change to National Headquarters. All changes must first go through department headquarters for processing. Any changes received by National Headquarters directly from a post will be returned with no action taken.

Post Officer Certification

It is critical for the post adjutant to report all post officers

to department headquarters immediately after election. The department may furnish a special reporting form or the post may receive reporting forms provided to the department by National Headquarters. All national mailings are addressed to post officers. It is imperative that all contact information for post officers be up-to-date and correct.


