EMBER'S **PAWS** OF HOPE: A nonprofit organization dedicated to providing emotional and mental support to veterans and first responders through the use of future certified therapy dog(s). Members of our team have a diverse background which include being trained in critical incident stress management and peer support, and we visit fire

stations, police stations, hospitals, and veterans facilities to offer comfort and companionship to those who serve our communities.

THE ANGEL: Ember was 9 weeks old when she moved in with Tim Nickels, the goal was to have Ember become a therapy dog. It was discovered that Ember was too attached to Tim but no one knew that would save him later on. Anytime Tim was having a hard day or a bad shift Ember would sit with Tim. Tim was



diagnosed with PTSD in 2020, Ember wouldn't leave his side. Ember knew something was up. Tim became suicidal and made attempts to end his life. Ember stopped him at least three times. When the days were dark, Ember wouldn't let him leave without her.

THE PROJECT: National American Legion asks Departments to partner with local organizations to support BE THE ONE. Commander McKenzie has chosen to partner with Ember's Paws of Hope (EPOH), an organization committed to provide, comfort, support, and emotional healing to veterans and first responders through the unconditional love and companionship of therapy dog. Non-profit Q&A: 501(c)(3) vs 501(c)(19)

What is the difference between a 501(c)(3) and a 501(c)(19)?

The difference between 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(19) organizations lies in their purpose, membership requirements, and permitted activities. 501(c)(3) organizations are exclusively for religious, charitable, or educational purposes, while 501(c)(19) is a specialized category for veterans' organizations.

Comparison of 501(c)(3) and 501(c)(19):

Feature	501(c)(3) (Charitable Organizations)	501(c)(19) (Veterans' Organizations)
Primary purpose	Organizations operated exclusively for charitable, religious, educational, scientific, or literary purposes.	Posts or organizations of past or present members of the United States Armed Forces.
Membership	Open to the general public, with no specific military service requirements.	At least 75% of members must be past or present members of the U.S. armed forces. In addition, 97.5% of total members must be either veterans, cadets, or their families.
Political activity	Strictly limited: May engage in an insignificant amount of lobbying but are prohibited from any political campaign activity, such as endorsing candidates.	Permitted: Can engage in lobbying and limited political activities, which are generally forbidden for 501(c)(3)s.
Member benefits	Prohibited from using net earnings to benefit any private individual or shareholder.	Allowed to provide life, sick, accident, or health insurance benefits to members and their dependents.
Social activities	Must be insignificant to the organization's overall purpose to avoid unrelated business income tax.	Permitted to offer social and recreational activities for members, such as a bar, restaurant, or legal gambling.
Donor deductibility	Contributions are generally tax-deductible to the donor.	Contributions are tax- deductible to the donor, provided the organization meets specific IRS rules, such as having 90% war veteran membership.
Geographic scope	May conduct activities and be organized in foreign countries under certain circumstances.	Must be organized in the U.S. or its possessions.


