Mission Working Dogs

Their MISSION: To improve the lives of their community members who are living with a disability by providing them with properly trained service dogs to help them live more independently despite a physical disability and by providing therapy dogs which will bring mental well-being to the people of Maine such as those in nursing homes, hospitals, and schools.

Their VISION: At Mission Working Dogs, we train purpose-bred dogs to aid individuals with disabilities so that the handler can live a life to the fullest and more independently.

Their GOAL: Service dogs can assist those with physical disabilities such as mobility impairments by fetching dropped items, opening doors, and turning on and off lights. They can also help individuals with PTSD by learning to recognize an increase in anxiety, carrying medications, and providing deep pressure therapy to calm or redirect the handler. Dogs working as facility dogs are often trained to recognize a patient's affected side in the case of a stroke and to approach on the side the patient is able to pet with or throw the ball. Patients are able to work on fine motor movements in petting or caring for the dog as well as gross motor skills playing fetch with a dog that's able to bring the ball exactly to where the patient needs, such as on a side table or directly into their hand, rather than on the ground or trying to play tug with it inappropriately.

Their PLAN: Service dogs are generally trained for approximately two years and undergo a wide range of assessments on their physical health, temperament, and tasks or skills to make sure they can properly support their handler throughout life.



5 Things to Know, Oct. 21, 2024

- 1. Two Navy aviators who were flying an EA-18G Growler jet in Washington state when it crashed Tuesday were declared dead on Sunday, the service said in a statement. The announcement came after days of searching and efforts to reach the wreckage in a remote mountainous area west of Yakima. The Navy said the names of the two aviators will not be released until 24 hours after their next of kin have been notified, and that the cause of the crash is under investigation.
- 2. Israel's military announced Sunday it is now taking aim at the Lebanon-based Hezbollah's financial arm and will attack a "large number of targets" in Beirut and elsewhere. Explosions began in Beirut's southern suburbs about an hour later. Evacuation warnings affected southern Beirut, the eastern Bekaa valley and parts of southern Lebanon. AP video showed strikes near Lebanon's only airport but it continued to operate. The strikes will target al-Qard al-Hassan "all over Lebanon," a senior Israeli intelligence official said. Al-Qard al-Hassan is a Hezbollah unit that's used to pay operatives of the Iran-backed militant group and help buy arms, the official said, speaking on condition of anonymity in line with army regulations.
- 3. John Kinsel Sr., one of the last remaining Navajo Code Talkers who transmitted messages during World War II based on the tribe's native language, has died. He was 107. Navajo Nation officials in Window Rock announced Kinsel's death on Saturday. Tribal President Buu Nygren has ordered all flags on the reservation to be flown at half-staff until Oct. 27 at sunset to honor Kinsel. "Mr. Kinsel was a Marine who bravely and selflessly fought for all of us in the most terrifying circumstances with the greatest responsibility as a Navajo Code Talker," Nygren said in a statement Sunday.
- 4. A Canadian frigate joined a U.S. Navy warship for a trip through the Taiwan Strait on Sunday, less than a week after China concluded a large-scale military exercise around Taiwan. The guided-missile destroyer USS Higgins and the frigate HMCS Vancouver cruised southwest through the 110-mile-wide waterway that separates Taiwan from mainland China as part of a routine transit, the U.S. 7th Fleet said in a news release Monday. "As part of normal operations, the ships were conducting a transit of the Taiwan Strait from the South China Sea to the East China Sea in accordance with international law," 7th Fleet spokesman Lt. Victor Murkowski told Stars and Stripes by email Monday.
- 5. U.S. Defense Secretary Lloyd Austin arrived in Kyiv on an unannounced visit Monday, hours after a Russian drone attack on the Ukrainian capital and as Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy pushes Western partners to keep providing military support for the war. Austin said on the X platform that his fourth visit shows "that the United States, alongside the international community, continues to stand by Ukraine." Ukraine is having difficulty holding back a ferocious Russian campaign along the eastern front that is gradually compelling Kyiv's forces to give up a series of towns, villages and hamlets.

Verizon Messages+ Is Shutting Down

Verizon has announced the discontinuation of its messaging app, Message+. The process of discontinuing the service will take over a month, and Verizon is recommending people switch to RCS or iMessages.

The Message+ app by Verizon will be completely discontinued by November 7, 2024. The shutdown will begin on October 2, 2024, but users will definitely no longer be able to send or receive messages through the app after November 7. Any messages scheduled to be sent after that date will not be delivered. The app will also be removed from the Apple App Store and Google Play Store. Verizon said the rise of Rich Communication Services (RCS) was the primary reason for this decision. RCS gives a more modern messaging experience with features like typing indicators, read receipts, and high-quality media sharing. Google Messages, preloaded on all Verizon Android devices, supports RCS. Verizon recommended that Android owners switch to **Google Messages** and that iPhone and iPad owners use **Apple Messages**.

The transition to Google Messages is straightforward. Users can download the app if it's not already on their device and set it as their default messaging app. Verizon also said in their FAQ that email aliases associated with Message+ will no longer function after the shutdown. Probably to prepare for the app closing, Verizon had already discontinued the ability to send and receive text messages on its website as of December 11, 2023. However, Users can still access their message history on the website. The sale of eGift cards through Message+ also ended in April 2024, though previously purchased eGift cards can still be redeemed.

This move by Verizon follows a similar trend in the industry; Samsung has also been migrating users from its messaging app to Google Messages, and Apple adopted RCS in iOS 18. This is basically making the technology a standard for mobile messaging. If this trend continues, we may soon see the end of dedicated carrier messaging apps.
