EMBER'S **PAWS** OF **HOPE:** A nonprofit organization dedicated to providing emotional and mental support to veterans and first responders through the use of future certified therapy dog(s). Members of our team have a diverse background which include being trained in critical incident stress management and peer support, and we visit fire

stations, police stations, hospitals, and veterans facilities to offer comfort and companionship to those who serve our communities.

THE ANGEL: Ember was 9 weeks old when she moved in with Tim Nickels, the goal was to have Ember become a therapy dog. It was discovered that Ember was too attached to Tim but no one knew that would save him later on. Anytime Tim was having a hard day or a bad shift Ember would sit with Tim. Tim was



diagnosed with PTSD in 2020, Ember wouldn't leave his side. Ember knew something was up. Tim became suicidal and made attempts to end his life. Ember stopped him at least three times. When the days were dark, Ember wouldn't let him leave without her.

THE PROJECT: National American Legion asks Departments to partner with local organizations to support BE THE ONE. Commander McKenzie has chosen to partner with Ember's Paws of Hope (EPOH), an organization committed to provide, comfort, support, and emotional healing to veterans and first responders through the unconditional love and companionship of therapy dog. Nat'l Veterans Employment & Education Awards

Nomination forms for the Veterans Employment and Education awards are available through American Legion department headquarters at www.mainelegion.org under FORMS/APPLICATIONS. There are five available awards.

National Employer of Veterans Award. This award is offered in three categories: Category I – Employers of more than 200 employees (Large); Category II – Employers of 51-200 employees (Medium); Category III – Employers of 1-50 employees (Small).

National Employment Service Award. This award is offered in three categories: Local Veteran Employment Representative (LVER) of the Year; Disabled Veteran Outreach Program Specialist (DVOP) of the Year; Employment Service (ES) Local Office of the Year

Enhance the Lives of Disabled Persons Award. A Legion project or program that improves the quality of life for disabled persons will be considered for this award.

National Employer of Older Worker Award. The American Legion provides an Employer of Older Worker Award for a company that consistently hires older workers, especially veterans.

Michael Guty Homeless Veterans Outreach Award. Any Legion project or program with a goal of ending homelessness among veterans will be considered for this award.

Nomination forms for the Veterans Employment and Education awards are available through American Legion department headquarters. All entries must be accompanied by an official nomination form with no more than two pages of narrative, along with supporting documents. Departments will send reminders to all posts about nominations. The department then selects one nominee as its winner and sends the nomination form for the winning employer. That nomination form must be signed by either the department adjutant or department employment chairman. Selection of the national winners will be made by the Veterans Employment & Education Commission during the annual Washington Conference. The national winners will receive a stipend for travel expenses and are presented award plaques at the National Convention.

The American Legion Style Guide Standards & Best Practices

Appropriate Use of American Legion Frequently Used Terms

In most circumstances, The American Legion follows AP style, as outlined in the latest editions of The Associated Press Stylebook and Webster's New World College Dictionary.

Be the One No quotation marks. Refer to as The American Legion's Be the One initiative, not campaign.

Capitol Capitalize U.S. Capitol and the Capitol when referring to the building in Washington, D.C. Do the same for state capitol buildings: the lowa State Capitol.

congressman, congresswoman U.S. representative, representative and member of Congress are preferred.

department executive committee Capitalize when referring to a specific department: Wisconsin's Department Executive Committee. Avoid abbreviating DEC.

flag Lowercase in all references: the flag, the U.S. flag. Capitalize Grand Old Flag, Old Glory and the Star-Spangled Banner.

four pillars Phrase refers to The American Legion's central missions: Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation, National Security, Americanism, and Children & Youth. Sometimes shortened to Veterans, Security, Americanism, Youth. Lowercase preferred: the four pillars upon which The American Legion was founded, the Legion's four pillars.

government Always lowercase, never abbreviate: the federal government, the state government, the U.S. government.

legislature Capitalize when preceded by the name of a state: the Colorado Legislature.

National Emergency Fund NEF on second reference.

Paid Up For Life PUFL acceptable on second reference.

past national commander Capitalize when the title precedes a name. PNC is acceptable on second reference, particularly when referring to a group: PNCs Dellinger, Oxford and Helm.

resolution Capitalize and abbreviate only when referring to a specific, numbered resolution: the NEC passed a resolution, Res. No. 30.

servicemember One word. Preferred over servicemen and servicewomen.

LEGION FAMILY MEMBERSHIP CRITERIA

American Legion

You must have served at least one day of active military duty since December 7, 1941, and have an honorable discharge or be currently serving honorably. This includes all U.S. military members who have served during a qualifying period, such as World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam, or current campaigns. The LEGION Act of 2019 expanded eligibility to include anyone who served since December 7, 1941, not just during designated war eras.

Eligible military branches:

- U.S. Army
- U.S. Navy
- U.S. Air Force
- U.S. Marine Corps
- U.S. Coast Guard
- U.S. Merchant Marine (eligible only from December 7, 1941, to December 31, 1946)
- National Guard/Reserves (all basic training and occupational training schools were considered federal active-duty service)

Eligibility for membership is open to individuals who have served at least one day of federal active duty since December 7, 1941, and were honorably discharged or are still serving honorably.

Sons of The American Legion

All male descendants adopted sons, and stepsons *of members of The American Legion*, and such male descendants of veterans *who died in service* during the period of April 6, 1917, through November 11, 1918, or any time from December 7, 1941, to date, who served honorably, as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, of the National Constitution of The American Legion, or who died subsequent to their honorable discharge from such service, shall be eligible for membership in the Sons of The American Legion.

American Legion Auxiliary

Membership in The American Legion Auxiliary shall be limited to the:

- (1) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of members of The American Legion; and
- (2) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who served in either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918 and any time after December 7, 1941 who, being a citizen of the United States at the time of their entry therein served on active duty in the Armed Forces of any of the governments associated with the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge;
- (3) grandmothers, mothers, sisters, spouses, and direct and adopted female descendants of all men and women who were in the Armed Forces of the United States during either of the following periods: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918; and any time after December 7, 1941 who served on active duty in the Armed Forces of the United States during either eligibility periods and died in the line of duty or after honorable discharge; and (4) to those women who of their own right are eligible for membership in The American Legion. *
- * A woman who is eligible for American Legion membership is eligible to join the American Legion Auxiliary regardless of whether or not she is a member of The American Legion. However, eligibility of her female relatives (sister, mother, direct descendants) and/or spouse depends upon her membership in The American Legion.
