AMERICAN LEGION MULTI-YEAR MEMBERSHIP IS HERE

The American Legion Dec 04, 2023

E liminate the yearly hassle of remembering to renew your American Legion membership by taking advantage of the new multiyear membership available to current and potential members. Legionnaires needing to renew for 2024 or veterans joining the organization for the first time can lock-in a three-year membership by visiting <u>legion.org/renew</u> or <u>legion.org/join</u>.

A multiyear membership was approved by the National Executive Committee of The American Legion during the organization's Spring Meetings last May. Resolution 1: Purchase of Multiple Years of Membership approves "a five-year pilot program offering the purchase of three consecutive 12-month member terms at the then current dues rate."

Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:

- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the national American Legion website. Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a threeyear membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.
- Renew now with a three-year membership by visiting <u>legion.org/renew</u>.
- > Join now with a three-year membership by visiting legion.org/join.
- Legionnaires already renewed for 2024 will soon be able to renew under the multiyear membership starting with the 2025 membership year.
- > Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.
- > There is not a discounted rate with the three-year membership.
- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.
- Those who sign up for a multiyear membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time they have signed up for the multiyear membership.

Please note that the multiyear membership will work just like PUFL. Whatever rate the member renews at is the what the post/department/national will receive for the duration of that timeframe. For example, if a member renews today (before national per-capita \$5 dues increase come July 1, 2024), National will receive \$18.50 for the next three years. Let's say the department's per capita is currently \$10 and is going to raise to \$15 come July 1, 2024. The department will receive the \$10 for the next three years. Once the member renews after the three year renewal is up, the renewal rate will adjust to the rate at that time.

A ccredited American Legion service officers helped veterans obtain more than \$16.5 billion in VA disability benefits in 2023, and national staff appeals representatives handled no fewer than 13,187 claims.

Their work capped a big year in American Legion service and advocacy that also included an all-timehigh Operation Comfort Warriors grant delivered in Alabama; a big jump in the Tango Alpha Lima podcast audience; and growing support for the Legion's Be the One mission.

A SCHOLARSHIP FOR CHILDREN OF THE FALLEN, DISABLED

If you are the child of a parent who lost their life while honorably serving on active military duty on or after 9/11, or is a post-9/11 veteran with a combined VA disability rating of 50 percent or higher, you are eligible to apply for The American Legion Legacy Scholarship.

The 2024 American Legion Legacy Scholarship application is online. The application deadline is March 27.

Since the Legacy Scholarship's first grant in 2004, 825 military children of the fallen and disabled have received over \$6.2 million in financial assistance for higher learning. The following are ways the scholarship has helped recipients:

"Receiving this scholarship over the course of my medical school career has truly been a life-changing opportunity for me. This scholarship helped me alleviate the financial stress that comes with the rigorous training required to become a doctor."

"Thank you for awarding me with The American Legion Legacy Scholarship. It is a great privilege to be a recipient of your generosity, and I look forward to utilizing these funds in pursuit of my college education. Your help will allow me to pursue my dreams of becoming an officer of the CIA and for that I am extremely grateful."

The Legacy Scholarship provides financial aid for graduate or post-graduate tuition, books, room and board, meal plans and other supplies needed to achieve a higher education. It is a needs-based scholarship – the grant amount each scholarship recipient will receive will be based on his or her financial need after all federal and state aid is exhausted. Recipients will have a year to use the grant and may reapply to The American Legion Legacy Scholarship up to six times.

The number of scholarships awarded and the amount of financial aid granted to each awardee (this includes returning applicants) will be determined on donations to the scholarship fund and one's financial needs.

These Apps Drain Your Phone's Battery the Most



No huge surprise: Social media and dating apps suck the most battery life out of your phone.

When your phone's battery level is low, you probably have only yourself to blame. But it's nice to have someone else to pin it on, too—or rather, something. Phone-storage app company pCloud decided to help out by analyzing app permissions to find which are operating in your phone, whether you're using them or not.

The methodology involved looking at which functions the apps used (such as location or camera), how much battery power those require, and whether the apps in question have a dark-mode setting. By those standards, the top five biggest drains are Facebook, Fitbit, Skype, Uber, and Verizon.

Not so coincidentally, the apps that are the biggest time sucks are also among the biggest battery drainers. Social media apps including Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, Snapchat, YouTube, and WhatsApp are in the top 20, and all permit 11 features to run in the background. Online dating can be emotionally exhausting, and your phone feels the same way. Bumble, Grindr, and Tinder account for 15% of the top battery-draining apps. They each let about 11 features run while you swipe on potential matches.

You can see which apps are using the most battery power on your own device by going into settings, selecting battery, and looking at battery usage by app. You just might find that your Twitter habit is 59% of your phone activity. (I'm not naming names here. OK, it's me.)

Changing your behavior is obviously one way to save battery life, but if you want to go the path of least resistance, we've got easy battery-saving **tips for iPhone** and **Android** users that are more set-itand-forget-it.

Eligibility Questions

- Q. What are the eligibility dates for membership in The American Legion?
- A. Thanks to the LEGION Act (Let Everyone Get Involved In Opportunities for National Service Act), Congress expanded the current eligibility period to cover Dec. 7, 1941, to the present, and includes the current war campaigns. Previously, there were seven declared war periods. Now there are two, the current war period dating back to World War II and another war era covering World War I. No other restrictions to American Legion membership changed.
- Q. I'm currently on active duty. Am I eligible?
- A. Yes, you are a veteran. All current active duty military are eligible for membership.
- Q. I didn't retire from the military, but was on active duty during one of the qualifying time periods. Am I eligible?
- A. Yes, you are a veteran. As long as you have served at least one day of federal active duty during any qualifying period, you are eligible for membership.
- Q. I served during one of the qualifying periods, but was never in a combat zone. Am I eligible?
- A. Yes, you are a veteran. Location of active duty service is not a consideration for membership.

How can a Veteran prepare before starting their application?

- Be sure to fill out their claim completely.
- Gather any evidence (supporting documents) they'll submit themselves when they file their VA disability claim. We encourage them to send in all their supporting documents along with their claim. This will help us process their claim quickly. <u>Learn about fully developed</u> <u>claims</u>
- Find out if they'll need to turn in any additional forms with their claim. Learn about additional forms Veterans may need to file

What evidence does a Veteran need to support their claim?

They can support their VA disability claim by providing these documents:

- VA medical records and hospital records. These could relate to their claimed illnesses or injuries or they could show that their rated disability has gotten worse.
- **Private medical records and hospital reports.** These could relate to their claimed illnesses or inju- ries or they could show that their disability has gotten worse.
- **Supporting statements.** These could be from family members, friends, clergy members, law enforce- ment personnel, or people they served with. These statements could tell us more about their claimed condition and how and when it happened or how it got worse.

Depending on the type of claim a Veteran files, they may gather supporting documents themselves, or they can ask for our help to gather evidence. We'll also review their discharge papers (DD214 or other separation documents) and service treatment records.

Learn more about the evidence we'll need for their claim

Does a Veteran need to submit evidence with their claim?

No. A Veteran doesn't have to submit any evidence to support their claim. But we may need to schedule a claim exam so we can learn more about their condition.

Learn more about VA claim exams (C&P exams)

A Veteran should also know that they have up to a year from the date we receive their claim to turn in any evidence. If they start their application and need time to gather more supporting documents, they can save their application and come back later to finish it. We'll recognize the date they started their application as their date of claim as long as they complete it within 365 days.

Should a Veteran submit an intent to file form?

If they plan to file for disability compensation using a paper form, they may want to submit an intent to file form first. This can give them the time they need to gather their evidence while avoiding a later potential start date (also called an effective date). When they notify us of their intent to file, they may be able to get retroactive payments (compensation that starts at a point in the past).

Note: If they file for disability compensation online, then they don't need to notify us of their intent to file. This is because their effective date gets set automatically when they start filling out the form online— before they submit it.

How does a Veteran file a claim for compensation?

They can file for disability compensation in any of these 5 ways:

1. Online:

Veterans' can file a claim online now at www.va.gov File for disability compensation online

2. By Mail:

File a Veteran's claim by mail using an Application for Disability Compensation and Related Compensation Benefits (VA Form 21-526EZ).

3. In Person:

With the Help of a Trained Professional:

A Veteran can work with a trained professional called an accredited representative to get help filing a claim for disability compensation.

There are five Veterans Service Organizations located on the Togus Campus: American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Maine Veterans' Services, Paralyzed Veterans of America, and Veterans of Foreign Wars

What happens after a Veteran files their VA disability claim?

Find out what happens after a Veteran files

A Veteran doesn't need to do anything while they're waiting unless we send them a letter asking for more information. If we schedule exams for them, they should be sure not to miss them.
