### BLACK HISTORY MONTH: A TIME TO HONOR AND SHARE

Dear American Legion Family members and friends,

America's story is written in the sweat and blood of military heroism, valor and service – the willingness and ability to train, fight and die if necessary for the principles of justice, freedom and democracy. Since the American Revolution, that story has been authored by men and women of multiple backgrounds. For too long, however, the role of Black Americans in our nation's military journey has been under-told, mis-told, forgotten or, worse, deliberately hidden.

The American Legion has persistently called for reconsideration of military medals and citations that were previously denied or diminished in stature, potentially due to racial discrimination of the past.

Since Congress began mandating such reviews in the 1990s through the Defense Authorization Act, 30 Medals of Honor have been awarded to previously overlooked Black veterans of World War II.

In October 2020, <u>The American Legion National</u> <u>Executive Committee passed a resolution</u> in support of legislation "to lift statutes of limitations and other obstacles that may impede proper investigation and appropriate actions for minority veterans of all wars and conflicts whose military records and official descriptions of combat actions fully support consideration for award of the Medal of Honor and any other military medal."

And now – February 2023, Black History Month – I truly believe we can take the spirit of that resolution a few steps further. Multiple web platforms now exist to study and collect the stories of all veterans and one in particular, at <u>the George S. Robb Centre</u> for the Study of the Great War, is focused on correcting the record for minority veterans of World War I. The American Legion and the U.S. World War I Centennial Commission support the center's research and database, titled "Stories of Courage, Tenacity, and Valor Told."

Black History Month is also an ideal time to submit stories and photos to the <u>Veterans History Project</u> <u>at the Library of Congress</u>. We also strongly encourage female veterans and their families to contribute their stories to the <u>Military Women's</u> <u>Memorial registry</u>. The <u>Vietnam Veterans Memorial</u> <u>Fund also offers opportunities to share stories and images of those whose names are enshrined in the</u> <u>Wall</u>. Dozens of other searchable sites are available to complete the picture of our nation's military heritage and to learn from it. The American Legion also continues to collect stories and photos from veterans and their families through the <u>Legiontown platform, which has</u> <u>categories ranging from MY WORLD WAR II</u> <u>STORY to Memories of Basic Training</u>, and Black History Month is a great time to add to the growing list of submissions. These contributions not only strengthen our commitment to "preserve the memories and incidents of our associations in all wars," they also fill in gaps that Black History Month and other such recognitions aim to improve today and, most importantly, for generations to come.

### PACT ACT FRAUD PREVENTION

U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs JAN 31, 2023



On August 10, 2022, President Biden signed <u>the</u> <u>Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring</u> <u>Our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxins</u> <u>Act of 2022 (PACT Act)</u> — possibly the largest expansion of Veterans benefits in history — into law.

The PACT Act expands Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) health care and benefits for Veterans exposed to burn pits and other toxic substances, and it helps VA provide generations of Veterans and their survivors with the care and benefits they've earned and deserve.

However, predatory companies are targeting Veterans' retroactive benefit payments and VA needs your continued support to help us educate Veterans and their survivors about the types of fraud tactics being used against them – especially now that the PACT Act has been passed.

Some predatory companies, not accredited by VA, are targeting Veterans by offering to assist them with their VA benefit claim. These companies charge absurd fees or require those applying to pay a portion of their VA benefits for this 'help'. VA will never charge Veterans or their family members to apply for the benefits they may be entitled to receive.

Please share the following information with Veterans and their survivors to help them guard against fraud and scams:

- Apply directly to VA. You may submit your application securely **online** via VA.gov or in person at any regional office. You may file your claim directly with VA, and VA will help gather the necessary evidence to support it. There are no costs or hidden fees to apply.
- Be suspicious of media advertisements from companies which provide information about the PACT Act and suggest you can only obtain benefits with their help. These companies may not be accredited with VA and may be attempting to charge you illegal fees.
- Use the VA Office of General Counsel (OGC) Accreditation Search to confirm and validate the credentials of anyone offering claims assistance.
- Be cautious of aggressive law firms or companies expressing a sense of urgency and insisting you must act now.
- Do not sign a contract agreeing to pay an unauthorized company a fee to help you with your VA claim. There are accredited Veterans Service Organizations, agents and attorneys who may assist you.

- Be cautious of companies claiming to be contacting you on behalf of VA. Contact VA directly at 1-800 -827-1000 if you are unsure about the authenticity of a message you've received.
- Review all documents thoroughly. Never sign a blank form for someone else to complete later. Always review the fully completed form.

### **Helpful Resources and Tools**

Veterans and their survivors who think they might be eligible should apply for PACT Act benefits right now. Go to **www.va.gov/PACT** or call 1-800-MYVA411 for more information.

To report suspected fraud or predatory companies, please contact VA OIG (OIG) Hotline (va.gov).

Veterans and their survivors who suspect a company is using predatory practices, should file a complaint with the Federal Trade Commission and the Better Business Bureau. For more information on how to avoid scams, go to https://www.fcc.gov/veteranstargeted-benefits-scams.

### **TECHNOLOGY 101**

is a resource for those who wish to learn basic skills with the powerful technology of today's world. Increased proficiency with computers and cell-phones is good both personally and professionally.



### **CLOUD STORAGE**

**Cloud storage** is a model of <u>computer data storage</u> in which the <u>digital data</u> is stored in logical <u>pools</u>, said to be on "the cloud". The <u>physical storage</u> spans multiple <u>servers</u> (sometimes in multiple locations), and the physical environment is typically owned and managed by <u>a hosting</u> company. These cloud storage providers are responsible for keeping the data <u>available</u> and <u>accessible</u>, and the physical environment secured, protected, and running. People and organizations buy or lease storage capacity from the providers to store user, organization, or application data.

<u>Cloud storage services</u> may be accessed through a <u>colocated cloud computing</u> service, a <u>web service</u> <u>application programming interface</u> (API) or by applications that use the API, such as <u>cloud desktop</u> storage, a <u>cloud storage gateway</u> or Web-based <u>content management systems</u>.

**History:** Cloud computing is believed to have been invented by **J. C. R. Licklider** in the 1960s with his work on **ARPANET** to connect people and data from anywhere at any time.

In 1983, <u>**CompuServe</u>** offered its consumer users a small amount of disk space that could be used to store any files they chose to upload.</u>

In 1994, <u>AT&T</u> launched PersonaLink Services, an online platform for personal and business communication and entrepreneurship. The storage was one of the first to be all web-based, and referenced in their commercials as, "you can think of our electronic meeting place as the cloud." <u>Amazon Web Services</u> introduced their cloud storage service <u>Amazon S3</u> in 2006, and has gained widespread recognition and adoption as the storage supplier to popular services such as <u>SmugMug</u>, <u>Dropbox</u>, and <u>Pinterest</u>. In 2005, <u>Box</u> announced an online file sharing and personal cloud content management service for businesses.
