MULTIYEAR MEMBERSHIP OPEN TO 2025 RENEWALS



The American Legion JAN 22, 2024

If you renewed for the 2024 American Legion membership year prior to the new multiyear membership rollout on Dec. 4, you can now take advantage of a three-year membership starting with the 2025 membership year.

Visit legion.org/renew for the multiyear membership of 2025, 2026 and 2027.

Legionnaires still needing to renew for 2024 or veterans joining the organization for the first time can also lock-in a three-year membership (2024, 2025 and 2026) by visiting legion.org/renew or legion.org/join.

Here is what you need to know about the three-year membership:


- Multiyear membership sign-up is only available on the national American Legion website (legion.org/ renew and legion.org/join). Current or potential members cannot renew or join for a three-year membership at the post level or through MyLegion.org.

- Payment for the three-year membership will be upfront.
- There is not a discounted rate with the three-year membership.
- Membership cards will still be sent annually by Legion posts.
- Those who sign up for a multiyear membership will not receive a renewal notice during the time they have signed up for the multiyear membership.

Please note that the multiyear membership will work just like PUFL. Whatever rate the member renews at is what the post/department/national will receive for the duration of that timeframe. For example, if a member renews today (before national per-capita \$5 dues increase come July 1, 2024), National will receive \$18.50 for the next three years. For example, if a department's per capita is currently \$10 and is going to be raised to \$15 on July 1, 2024, then the department will receive the \$10 for the next three years. Once the member renews after the three-year renewal is up, the renewal rate will adjust to the rate at that time.

A multiyear membership was approved by the National Executive Committee of The American Legion during the organization's Spring Meetings last May. Resolution 1: Purchase of Multiple Years of Membership approves "a five-year pilot program offering the purchase of three consecutive 12-month member terms at the then current dues rate."

Today, the #1 issue facing those who served is veteran suicide. According to the National Veteran Suicide Prevention Annual Report. 17 veterans still die by suicide each day, or more than 6,000 each year. The rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults.

The American Legion is activating a national platform to end veteran suicide. The Be the One campaign will: Destignatize asking for mental health support, creating opportunities for those with mental health issues to speak freely and get the support they need; Provide peer-to-peer support and resources in local communities; Deploy FDAapproved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find resources for support.

BE THE ONE A FOCUS FOR MAINE LEGION FAMILY

As Maine American Legion Auxiliary president from 2022 to 2023, Debra Rumery's project was "You Will Never Walk Alone," a veteran suicide prevention and suicide awareness program. The project raised more than \$60,000 for the psychiatric ward and suicide prevention outreach program at the Togus VA Medical Center in Augusta, Maine.

After her tenure ended, Rumery saw the current American Legion Family national leadership - National Commander Daniel Seehafer, Auxiliary National President Lisa Williamson and Sons of The American Legion National Commander Donald L. "JR" Hall – were continuing to make the Legion's Be the One veteran suicide prevention program their top priority. And she wanted to make sure that continued in her state as well.

"I just knew our members needed to know that this wasn't something that I was only going to talk about for one year,"

said Rumery, who now serves as Maine's Alternate National Executive Committeeman and is a member of Unit 86 in Gray. "I was not going to stop talking about it. It was important for the whole (Legion Family) to know there is training out there, and I'd be willing to do the training for them."

That led Rumery to collaborate with Maine Legion Family leadership for a free Be the One training session on Jan. 27 at department headquarters. The session also included VA S.A.V.E. Training, which Rumery already had taken. Rumery provided the training alongside Maine Legionnaires Julie Flynn (Post 86) and Jennifer Kimble (Roderick-Crosby Post 28 in Farmington).

The trio delivered the S.A.V.E. Training, but Rumery said they wanted to offer more to those who braved the weather to attend the session. "We didn't want our members to travel all the way to department headquarters, which is a long way for a lot of people, for just 17 minutes (of training)," she said. "So, we elaborated on the VA S.A.V.E. We talked about the mission of Dan, Lisa and Don, and how The American Legion is going to have this mission to help destignatize our veterans asking for mental health support.

"We also added empathetic listening. I really believe that that was a huge part of this training: giving our members the tools to actually listen to a veteran when they're in mental health crisis. Not to dismiss them. The right things to say to them. Make sure that the empathetic listening feels like (the veteran) is being listened to, which I think, a lot of times, veterans don't feel that way."

Rumery said 18 Legion Family members attended the training. "It was the perfect amount of people because I felt like they felt comfortable being able to share their own experiences and feel safe in that environment," she said. "I'm not quite sure if they were in a larger environment ... if they would have been as transparent as they were. It worked out really, really great."

Three similar training sessions at department headquarters are planned, while Rumery said requests are being taken to travel to posts and deliver the training in person. She added that as Be the One has continued to grow since its inception in 2022, "People really started wanting more information. 'What can we do to help?' 'How can we learn more?' At the end of the training, we gave out resource packets to every single person that came, so they can go back to their post/unit/squadron/Riders chapter, whatever the case may be, so they can share the information.

"We didn't want this to just be the 18 people that were there. We wanted them to share this mission as well."

But Wait... There's More Eligibility Questions!

- **Q.** I served active duty as a SPAR, WAC, WASP, or WAVES during the one of the qualifying periods. Am I eligible?
- **A.** Yes, you are a veteran. Even though women served separately than men, their service is equal.
- Q. I served with allied military forces during one of the qualifying periods. Am I eligible?
- R. A. Yes, you are a veteran, only if you were a U.S. citizen at the time of entry.
- **Q.** I served with the Civil Air Patrol/Civilian Technical Corps/USPHS as a civilian during two qualifying periods. Am I eligible?
- A. No. Eligible members must have federal military service during a qualifying period and received an honorable discharge or discharge under honorable conditions.
- **Q.** I enlisted and went to basic training, but received an uncharacterized discharge due to a medical condition. Am I eligible?
- **A.** Yes, you are a veteran. Uncharacterized discharges for medical discharges are assumed to be under honorable conditions unless specifically stated otherwise. There are other categories of uncharacterized discharges and before they are determined eligible for membership the discharge should be sent to National for determination and a record will be maintained at National on final determination.
- **Q.** I'm eligible for The American Legion, but do not have a copy of my DD214 to show as proof of eligibility. How can I get one?
- **A.** You can go to archives.gov/veterans to request another copy of your discharge papers. A copy of orders putting you on federal active duty can be used as proof of eligibility as well.

How to Copy and Paste on an iPhone

To copy and paste text, you first need to select it:

- To select non-editable text (such as text on a web page), press and hold on any part of a word until it's highlighted.
- To select editable text (when the on-screen keyboard is showing), double-tap on a word to select it, or triple-tap on a paragraph to select it.

Whichever method you use, you can keep your finger pressed down and then move it to expand the selection. You'll also see handles at each edge of the selection, which you can tap and drag to change where the selection starts and stops. (Note: some apps handle text selection differently, but the press and hold action will usually work.)

Once you're done, a pop-up bar will appear above your selection. What appears in the bar can vary:

- Depending on the app and the text, you may see a Select All option listed. Tap this to select all the text on a page or in a section.
- If you see Cut and Copy options, just tap either to perform the action. If Cut isn't showing, the text can't be moved.
- If you prefer gestures, pinch closed with three fingers on the selection to copy the text, or pinch closed with three fingers two times to cut it.

You're then ready to paste the text:

- With the on-screen keyboard visible, tap on the screen where you want the text inserted.
- Pick Paste from the pop-up bar that appears.
- You can also pinch open with three fingers to paste text.
- If you're working on an editable document and want to move the text, you can simply select the text, tap and hold it, then drag it to a new location.

Copy and paste images

Copying and pasting images is a little more straightforward. To select an image in most apps, including Notes and Safari:

• Press and hold on the image.

• Tap Cut or Copy on the pop-up bar that appears. (Cut will only appear if you're working in an editable document).

Apple Photos doesn't work in the same way. To copy an image using that app:


- Tap the image thumbnail to make it full screen.
- Then tap the Share button (the square with the arrow, lower left), and choose Copy Photo.

That sends the image to the clipboard. To paste it somewhere else:

- With the on-screen keyboard showing, tap where you want to paste the image.
- Tap Paste on the pop-up bar.

If the app that you're pasting the image into supports image resizing, you'll see handles around the image that you can use to change its size. Note that you can't use the pinch gestures with images as you can with text.

How can a Veteran prepare before starting their application?

- Be sure to fill out their claim completely.
- Gather any evidence (supporting documents) they'll submit themselves when they file their VA disability claim. We encourage them to send in all their supporting documents along with their claim. This will help us process their claim quickly. <u>Learn about fully developed</u> <u>claims</u>
- Find out if they'll need to turn in any additional forms with their claim. Learn about additional forms Veterans may need to file

What evidence does a Veteran need to support their claim?

They can support their VA disability claim by providing these documents:

- VA medical records and hospital records. These could relate to their claimed illnesses or injuries or they could show that their rated disability has gotten worse.
- **Private medical records and hospital reports.** These could relate to their claimed illnesses or inju- ries or they could show that their disability has gotten worse.
- **Supporting statements.** These could be from family members, friends, clergy members, law enforce- ment personnel, or people they served with. These statements could tell us more about their claimed condition and how and when it happened or how it got worse.

Depending on the type of claim a Veteran files, they may gather supporting documents themselves, or they can ask for our help to gather evidence. We'll also review their discharge papers (DD214 or other separation documents) and service treatment records.

Learn more about the evidence we'll need for their claim

Does a Veteran need to submit evidence with their claim?

No. A Veteran doesn't have to submit any evidence to support their claim. But we may need to schedule a claim exam so we can learn more about their condition.

Learn more about VA claim exams (C&P exams)

A Veteran should also know that they have up to a year from the date we receive their claim to turn in any evidence. If they start their application and need time to gather more supporting documents, they can save their application and come back later to finish it. We'll recognize the date they started their application as their date of claim as long as they complete it within 365 days.

Should a Veteran submit an intent to file form?

If they plan to file for disability compensation using a paper form, they may want to submit an intent to file form first. This can give them the time they need to gather their evidence while avoiding a later potential start date (also called an effective date). When they notify us of their intent to file, they may be able to get retroactive payments (compensation that starts at a point in the past).

Note: If they file for disability compensation online, then they don't need to notify us of their intent to file. This is because their effective date gets set automatically when they start filling out the form online— before they submit it.

How does a Veteran file a claim for compensation?

They can file for disability compensation in any of these 5 ways:

1. Online:

Veterans' can file a claim online now at www.va.gov File for disability compensation online

2. By Mail:

File a Veteran's claim by mail using an Application for Disability Compensation and Related Compensation Benefits (VA Form 21-526EZ).

With the Help of a Trained Professional:

A Veteran can work with a trained professional called an accredited representative to get help filing a claim for disability compensation.

There are five Veterans Service Organizations located on the Togus Campus: American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Maine Veterans' Services, Paralyzed Veterans of America, and Veterans of Foreign Wars

A Veteran doesn't need to do anything while they're waiting unless we send them a letter asking for more information. If we schedule exams for them, they should be sure not to miss them.
