LETS PROMOTE THE VALUE OF MILITARY SERVICE

Dear American Legion Family members and friends,

As U.S. military veterans, we know the value of service.

Unfortunately, too many young people today do not. Worse yet, they are getting crossed signals from their peers, and even some adults.

Recruitment numbers are alarmingly down across the branches of service. <u>Army Maj. Gen. Johnny</u> <u>Davis told The American Legion's Veterans</u> <u>Employment & Education Commission last</u> <u>August</u> that a variety of reasons can be blamed. One that stands out to me is a term we are hearing often today – "propensity to serve."

That means young people simply are not aware of enough good reasons to take the oath. And at a time when industry, academia and government are all in competition for the best and brightest – a "war for talent," it has been called – we need to work harder to promote those good reasons.

At the Washington Conference in late February, Marine Corps Brig. Gen. Stephen Lightfoot asked Legionnaires to "provide that spark" to future generations and encourage them to start their journeys with military service. The benefits cannot be overstated – tuition assistance, industry-specific training for those about to discharge through such programs as DoD SkillBridge, GI Bill education, VA Home Loans, high-quality health care and superior insurance and banking through USAA, The American Legion's preferred provider of financial services, to name just a few.

Beyond those tangible advantages, we must also recognize the power and meaning of discipline unattainable in any other sector of society, along with lifelong camaraderie, the opportunity to see the world, help others in need and to protect those we love from enemies both foreign and domestic.

How can we help?

More than 6,200 American Legion posts conducted Veterans in the Classroom sessions last year. More than 33,000 young people participate annually in American Legion-sponsored Scouting units. Hundreds of Junior ROTC programs are backed by local Legion support. Schools have career events, and we must encourage them to welcome recruiters. More casually, consider the neighborhood barbecue, community picnic or church event as an opportunity to share with young people the value of military service. Wherever we make contact with young people deciding their future paths, let's commit to serve as ambassadors of the nation we swore with our lives to protect and defend. Let's answer the call Brig. Gen. Lightfoot made for us at the Washington Conference: "I need you to go on the offensive and share your service story. National service is powerful. We need to get the word out and share, at the local level, the power of service."

As I continue traveling our great nation this year, I want to hear how my fellow Legionnaires are answering that call and converting "propensity to serve" into a reason to join, rather than the alternate.

Thank you for helping us strengthen America every day.

To fulfill this and all of The American Legion's missions, it is vital to stay up to date on membership. If you have not already done so, <u>I strongly urge you to</u> renew now – as we celebrate the organization's 104th year of service to community, state and nation.

How to Take a Great Selfie: 5 Selfie Tips for Mastering the Art

We all take selfies. We take solo selfies after workouts and couple selfies while kissing. We take selfies with dogs and selfies while driving (more on selfie safety in a bit). And we take big group selfies with friends. You probably shot a selfie recently. Maybe earlier today. Before you strike another Blue Steel pose, take a minute to up your game and perfect your selfie skills. Here are 5 selfie tips for better digital self-portraits.

1. Face a light: Lighting is 80% of the selfie game. Find the light. You need the light. You're looking for diffused natural light. It's not around? Face the best light source. Get out of the bathroom and face a window. But beware of strong side lighting. Those shadows completely change your look.

2. Reach far with a straight arm: There's a distortion issue with closeup photos. When the camera is up close, things in the middle of the picture look bigger. That's your nose. This is one of the reasons selfies don't make good profile pictures. This also explains an increase in demand for nose jobs. According to a 2017 poll, 55% of facial plastic surgeons reported seeing patients who wanted surgery to help them look better in selfies, up from 13% the year before. So hold that arm out straight. If the pic is a selfie headshot, you're not reaching far enough. Your entire upper body should be in the shot.

3. Hold the camera high: Red-eye reduction is in the camera, but chin reduction is in the angle. Raising your arm will help feature your face, not your neck. Rise your arm. Get out a protractor and make sure it's 26 degrees. A low angle makes the viewer look up at you, putting you in the position of dominance. A high angle makes the viewer look down, making you look friendlier, cuter and thinner.

4. Squinch your eyes: It's a tip from pro photographers. Narrow your eyes a bit and you'll look more confident, a little mischievous, dangerous. It makes a huge difference. And if you really want to create eye contact, look away from yourself in the screen and look at the actual camera lens. It's that tiny dot in the corner of the phone.

5. The magic of group selfies: Selfies are best with friends. Selfies are better than traditional group photos. Stand on the right, so you can reach the shutter button easily. Take at least two because someone blinked. Delete the bad ones immediately. When a polite passerby asks if they can take that picture for you, tell them NO! Then invite them to be in your group selfie. There's always room for one more. It's possible to take mega-group selfies of 30+ people. Just stand on a chair. Cheers!

Seriously. Selfie accidents are no joke. Injuries are common enough that selfie sticks are banned in some theme parks. It's tempting to take a selfie for social media interaction as well, but don't get too wrapped up in the latest internet challenge that can result in death or lawsuits. Keep it safe and don't make that selfie the last picture you ever take.
