100 MILES FOR HOPE CHALLENGE INFORMATION

To: All Legion Leadership From: Dan Wheeler, National Adjutant

I wanted to direct your attention to a new challenge as part of this year's 100 Miles for Hope that allows members to support their departments while raising funds for the Veterans & Children Foundation. The national commander wanted to expand the Department Breakout Challenge for the entire duration of the 100 Miles for Hope challenge, which ends Sept. 5.

Here's how it works:

- Proceeds from registrations and donations go directly to the V&CF. If you haven't already registered, visit <u>www.legion.org/100miles</u> to register and learn more.
- For the breakout challenge, departments are divided up into categories by size. You can find out which category your department is in <a href="https://by.ncbi.nlm.
- The department in each category that raises the most money for the V&CF via the 100 miles challenge will receive a plaque from the national commander.
- To ensure that your fundraising gets credited to your department, **you must join its team.** There are two ways to join or support a department or team.
 - 1. Make a donation. To donate to your department, download this PDF to find your department. Then either click the link to go to your department donation page, or text your unique department code to 71777. After texting your department code, you will receive a link to donate to your department.
 - 2. **2.Fundraise.** Go to Mobile Cause to sign up and then choose "Become a fundraiser" then select a team. All of the departments have already been created. To join a team after initial set-up, log back into **your Mobile Cause page** or type in app.mobilecause.com/vf/100MFH/YourName and select edit at the bottom of the page, then click Join a Team.

Additionally, I wanted to share some resources with you to help promote this great program. Those include:

Promotional materials. National headquarters staff has created promotional items for participants to share. For example, there is a poster that can be displayed at your post, community center or elsewhere. Additionally, there is a small handout card with a QR code that can be given to someone to sign up or donate on the spot, or used as a leavebehind at a meeting. Visit legion.org/100miles/tools for these and other promotional items.

Share your story. The American Legion encourages all participants to share their 100 Miles for Hope journey. A few ways to do this is by sharing your progress and fundraising achievements on **the** Legiontown web page. And for social media posts, use the hashtag #100MilesForHope. Tag The American Legion and staff will help share your progress.

Facebook shares. An American Legion member has graciously volunteered to create personalized social media graphics that you can share on Facebook and other social media sites. All you need to do is send an email to her with a photo, and she will create one for you. Learn more at legion.org/100miles/share.

Create your own team. It is also possible for American Legion districts, posts or other entities that would like to create their own challenge against another group. For example, two posts, districts, or Riders chapters could create their own challenge. If you would like to create a new team, please email donorservices@legion.org.

THE AMERICAN LEGION DEPARTMENT OF MAINE CALLS ON THE LEADERSHIP OF MAINE VETERANS' HOMES TO FIX THE CHALLENGES OR TO STEP DOWN

The American Legion Department of Maine considers it irresponsible that The Maine Veterans' Homes considered closing the Machias and Caribou homes.

We, as a veteran's organization, have lost confidence in the CEO of Maine Veterans' Homes based upon these actions and the way they were handled.

The Maine Veterans' Homes system was created by an act of the Legislature in 1977, a system of six homes geographically placed to support an aging veterans population in the state of Maine, it is imperative that Maine keeps these homes viable in our opinion.

The American Legion Department of Maine sincerely appreciates those who have stepped in and offered support of the Machias and Caribou veterans' homes with deeds instead of words. We now ask that all involved move forward and make them viable for future generation of Maine's veterans.

The MVH CEO and board, in our opinion, were put in place is to lead the operation of the homes, keep them open, and keep them viable.

There were three concerns raised by the Maine Veterans' Homes leadership: Funding, staffing, and declining veteran population, which we wish to address.

- Funding: Thanks to Governor Janet Mills and Senate President Troy Jackson, it appears we have a start in turning around the funding challenges. Members of the Congressional delegation are standing by as well, according to recent meetings with our Department Legislative Committee.
- Staffing: The MVH must be creative in attracting staff. Offer incentives, educational assistance, and/ or more competitive wages. This is not a challenge specific to Maine Veterans' Homes; it has been an ongoing result of the COVID pandemic lockdowns and will take a creative approach to resolve.
- Veteran Population: We have an aging veteran population in Maine who may need these services in the very near future. A 2020 estimate shows Maine has 109,557 veterans. 50% of these veterans are over 65 years of age (55,214 estimated). Aroostook has an estimated 7,800 veterans and Washington County has an estimated 3,800 veterans with 50% possibly needing services. The next de-

mographic of veterans appears to be the Vietnam veterans. These veterans were treated poorly during the war, shutting down needed homes is another slap in the face to these veterans. Not to mention an aging 9-11 veteran population.

It took decades, and the support of Maine's Veterans Service Organizations, to open the six homes; which include Caribou and Machias. With their closure we will be facing a need with no options left to help our veterans. When future veterans need help, we will not have decades to get new homes built and operating.

Maine Veteran Homes has a mission of caring for those who served, in our opinion, to run these homes, keep them viable, and operational; we think closure contradicts that mission.

We are asking the Governor, the Legislature, Maine's Congressional delegation in Washington D.C., our brothers and sisters in Maine's Military Service Organizations, and the general public to support The American Legion Department of Maine's call to impress upon the MVH leadership to keep these homes open and viable, or to step down.



MS Word Tips and Tricks to Increase Productivity

- To **select an entire paragraph** make three rapid clicks anywhere in the paragraph
- Ctrl + click selects sentence. Click anywhere in a sentence while holding Ctrl key down will select the sentence
- To create a horizontal line type 3 hyphens and then press Enter
- Ctrl+ makes a word subscript and Ctrl Shift + makes a word superscript
- Pressing backspace while holding Ctrl key down deletes the preceding word
- USe Format Painter feature to quickly apply a particular format to a new area.
- Typing =rand(8,10) and then pressing Enter will automatically generate random text you can use for testing the page formatting, fonts, etc.
- To move cursor to the location where it was when you last save the document press **Shift** + **F5**
- Select some text -now if you will press Ctrl + Shift + > the font size of the selected text will increase. To decrease the font size use Ctrl + Shift + < combination
- To quickly create a table **type a plus sign (+) then press Tab key**; again type a plus and again press Tab key; do this as many times as the number of cells you want in your table. Then press Enter. And table shall appear!

Paid-Up-For-Life (PUFL) Agreement

- The applicant must be in good standing.
- National Headquarters reserves the right to require further information or confirmation of the member's eligibility, which
 may include a request for the member to provide a copy of his/her DD214 (or similar) or other documentation of age, military
 service or membership eligibility. The member's Paid-Up-For-Life application will be held pending verification.
- The member's Post will be notified of the new PUFL membership and will be permitted up to 30 days to challenge the application for acceptance.
- If payment is being made using a credit card, the full payment will be charged immediately. Payment can be made by MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express.
- 5. The permanent (plastic) PUFL card will be issued within 4-6 weeks of receipt and approval of the application.
- 6. No refund of payment(s) will be made if the member chooses to discontinue his/her PUFL membership at any time, once the application is approved and processed; the only exceptions are explained in Item 7. This also pertains to members participating in the Time Payment Plan whose account was closed due to delinquency. These members will not be eligible to participate in the Time Payment Plan in the future but may re-submit an application with <u>full payment</u> at any time. (Any funds previously submitted on the cancelled account <u>will not</u> be credited to the new application.)

Delinquent accounts may be closed with or without notice to the member. A delinquency will occur if the member's credit card payment is declined for any reason.
