VET CENTERS AS A MENTAL HEALTH SOLUTION

Dear American Legion Family Members and Friends,

Are you aware of the critical services provided by Vet Centers?

Eligible veterans and their families receive vital counseling and readjustment services from Vet Centers. Oftentimes, these veterans live in rural areas far from a VA medical facility.

In fact, Vet Centers also have mobile units. These make it possible to offer services even closer to where veterans live as well as dispatching the mobile unites to certain areas where the need is the greatest.

Currently there are more than 300 Vet Centers but that number will be increasing this spring, allowing even more veterans and their family members to be served. A recent American Legion <u>Tango Alpha</u> <u>Lima podcast episode</u> welcomed Army National Guard veteran Mike Fisher who is now the chief readjustment counseling officer for the organization. He covered a lot of ground — similar to Vet Centers — taking about their services, eligibility criteria, expansion and more.

He also sees the value in working with American Legion posts to deliver these services in rural areas.

"We send out staff to provide services in (outlying) communities," he said. "It could be borrowing space from a local American Legion location where we have a confidential counseling space where we provide services for that community."

The American Legion is a strong supporter of Vet Centers. Several years ago, we supported the Vet Center Eligibility Expansion Act.

Starting in 2022, <u>the act expanded eligibility</u> for readjustment counseling and related mental health services through Vet Centers to certain members of the Coast Guard, National Guard and reserves.

While we applaud VA for its strategic growth of Vet Centers, there also is room for more advancements. Notably, as a way to combat the rate of veterans who die by suicide.

That is why The American Legion is calling on Congress to support the funding, implementation and continued expansion of VA and communitybased mental health services through Vet Centers.

Seacoast Land Acquisitions and Home Innovations are planning to build a number of Specially Adapted Homes (SAH) for severely injured Veterans from all conflicts who live in Maine and qualify according to Veterans Administration guidelines.

The single-family homes will be built in a small subdivision and will include a community center where Veterans and their families can gather for special events and socialization.

All applicants for SAH will have to apply to the Veterans Administration to determine their eligibility. In addition, special SAH grants are available to eligible Veterans to assist in the purchase of these homes. AVA approved lender will be able to provide additional financing for the purchase of these homes, if needed.



How to Stay Safe From Phishing Scams

Phishing scams are one of the easiest ways that hackers can gain access to your personal and financial information. Unlike with <u>malware</u> or <u>malicious apps</u>, the hackers behind these scams don't have to trick you into installing any software. Instead, they use your emotions against you to trick you into clicking on links or downloading attachments.

For this reason, you don't want to rush when checking your inbox as hackers and other scammers often try to **instill a sense of urgency** in their phishing emails. They want you to get upset or stressed so that you'll do what the message says without thinking about it first. This is why you always want to try and keep a level head when dealing with phishing emails.

Likewise, you also want to look out for clear red flags like <u>misspelled words or poor grammar</u>. At the same time, you want to check the sender's email address to make sure that it's correct. Even then though, hackers often impersonate popular brands in their phishing messages by spoofing a company's email address.

Finally, you want to remember that most businesses rarely ask for personal or financial information over email. This is another sign that a message may not be genuine and could in fact be a phishing scam.

To protect your computer from malware and other viruses that could be installed as the result of opening a phishing email, you want to install the <u>best antivirus</u> <u>software</u> on your PC, the <u>best Mac antivirus software</u> on your Mac and one of the <u>best Android antivirus apps</u> on your Android smartphone.

This likely isn't the last time we'll see hackers impersonating Google in their attacks due to just how ubiquitous Google Search has become.
