

RSU 19 ADULT EDUCATION AND LOCAL AMERICAN LEGION JOIN FORCES TO COMBAT SUICIDE CRISIS.

In a powerful collaboration aimed at confronting and reducing the escalating suicide rates within our community, the RSU 19 Adult Education program is proud to announce a partnership with the local American Legion. This joint effort seeks to address a pressing crisis that sees Maine's suicide rate standing at a concerning 20.7 per 100,000 people in 2020, surpassing both regional and national averages, according to data from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs.

Veterans, who have served our country with honor, face an alarmingly higher risk of suicide compared to non-veteran adults. A 2017 report revealed that veterans are 22% more likely to take their own lives than their civilian counterparts. This risk increases to 19% among male veterans and 2.5 times among female veterans when adjusted for age differences.

Recognizing the urgency of these statistics, RSU 19 Adult Education and the American Legion are dedicating resources and expertise to spearhead initiatives that provide support, awareness and promote mental health and well-being among veterans and the broader community.

Event Invitation: A Conversation That Matters. RSU 19 Adult Education and the American Legion invite the community to join them on Tuesday, May 14th from 6-8pm for a vital discussion on suicide prevention and mental health awareness. This event represents a crucial step towards breaking the silence on a subject that is often difficult to approach yet is essential for fostering a supportive and proactive community environment. The event is being held at the American Legion Post 73 at 47 Maple Street in Corinna. You can register for this event by calling the Adult Education Office at 368-3290.

It is up to all of us educators, veterans, families and community members, to unite in this significant cause. Through education, support and open dialog, everyone can contribute to reducing the stigma associated with mental health issues and work towards a future where everyone feels valued, supported and empowered to seek help.

About RSU Adult Education: RSU 19 Adult Education is committed to providing adults with opportunities to develop skills and knowledge for education, employment and personal enrichment. Through a variety of programs and partnerships, they aim to support lifelong learning and community engagement.

Another Important Question!

When does my membership expire?

Your membership actually expires on Dec. 31 of the paid year shown on your card. It can be a little confusing because your annual dues are supposed to be paid by Jan. 1 each year so National starts accepting dues for the upcoming year on July 1. The goal is to have everyone renewed for the New Year by Jan. 1, when it begins.

If dues are not paid by Jan. 1 of each calendar year, the member becomes delinquent. Feb. 1, the member is suspended, June 30, the member is dropped from the membership rolls

How to Remove Facebook Access to Your Photos

Raise your hand if you've ever skimmed through the user agreements and legal jargon that appear when signing up for new software or services. (If you aren't raising your hand right now, you probably should be.) No one enjoys sifting through this dense information.

Unfortunately, by not reading service agreements thoroughly, you might inadvertently grant services access to things you'd prefer they didn't have. For instance, you may have unknowingly allowed the Facebook app to access the photos stored on your phone or tablet during the download process.

If you'd rather not give Facebook this level of access to your stored photos, you can modify the permissions even after installing the app. We'll guide you through the steps to protect your privacy concerning your photographs. Note that some images, like your profile picture and cover photo, are always visible to Facebook.

You can prevent Facebook from gaining access to your photos on your iPhone or iPad through the following steps.

- Tap on the Settings icon for your iPad or iPhone.
- Tap on Privacy & Security.
- In the next menu, tap on Photos.
- Find Facebook in the subsequent menu and tap on it.
- Tap **None** to deny Facebook access to your photos.

You can then exit all of the menus and continue using Facebook, knowing that your photos are safe.

You can deny Facebook access to your photos on your Android tablet or smartphone. Here's how.

(Settings may vary depending on your Android phone's manufacturer)

- Tap on the Settings icon on your Android device.
- In the subsequent menu, look for Apps and tap on it.
- In the list of apps stored on the Android device, scroll down and tap on Facebook.
- Scroll down the subsequent menu and tap on Permissions.
- In the Storage section of the next menu, turn **off** the slider button or tap **Don't Allow.**

After disabling photo access for Facebook, you may encounter frequent popup messages requesting you to restore access. Allowing access can simplify the process of uploading and sharing photos directly from your device to your Facebook page.

However, Facebook will not automatically post your personal photos without your permission; you decide which photos to upload. You might opt to restrict access to maintain privacy, ensuring that only selected photos are shared and preventing accidental posts of personal or sensitive images.

You can enjoy social media without sacrificing your privacy by taking a few moments to adjust your settings. Remember, it's your data, and you have the power to control who sees what. Stay informed, stay secure and keep your personal moments personal.




