Greetings to Maine Legionnaires,

Not long ago, we alerted you to The American Legion's campaign to pass our generation's most comprehensive veterans' health legislation and called on your help to pass it. You responded, and I am proud to share the results of your American Legion advocacy.

After months of negotiation and advocacy, the Senate voted 84-14 to pass the Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring Our PACT Act of 2022. The American Legion thanks not only those who voted for this legislation but the thousands of Legionnaires and advocates who worked to make this happen. We look forward to President Biden signing the Honoring Our PACT Act into law."

You are a part of today's victory. You contributed to the over 18,900 messages Legionnaires sent to Congress demanding action on toxic exposure, making this an issue our lawmakers could no longer ignore. Thank you for joining me on this campaign, and I ask that you keep your eye out for future "ALERT" messages from the Legion. See you in our future battles!

Background

- ➤ The American Legion is the nation's largest veterans service organization with more than 1.8 million members in more than 12,000 posts across the country and has its National Headquarters in Indianapolis, Indiana.
- The American Legion's mission is to enhance the well-being of America's veterans, their families, our military, and our communities by their devotion to mutual helpfulness.
- ➤ Throughout its more than 100-year history, members of The American Legion have tackled the most important issues and challenges facing our nation's veterans with each generation focused on solving the challenges faced before the ones that preceded them.
- The American Legion is racing to the future. New Era. New Look. Same Mission.
 - New Era. As the military changes, so does The American Legion. Today's service members and veterans come from diverse communities, have had different experiences, and enjoy wide-ranging interests.

- ➤ Today, the #1 issue facing those who served is veteran suicide.
 - According to the <u>National Veteran Suicide</u> <u>Prevention Annual Report.</u>
 - 17 veterans still die by suicide each day, or more than 6,000 each year.
 - ◆ Rate of suicide for veterans is more than 50% higher than that of non-veteran adults.
- ➤ The American Legion is activating a national platform to end veteran suicide.
- The **Be the One** campaign will:
 - Destignatize asking for mental health support, creating opportunity for those with mental health issues to speak freely and get the support they need.
 - Provide peer-to-peer support and resources in local communities.
 - Deploy FDA-approved therapeutics for veterans to identify issues and find resources for support.

What To Know

- 1. The stigma associated with mental health issues is a barrier to veterans seeking assistance. They fear loss of their job, think they can handle their situation themselves, or don't think others can understand their situation.
- 2. Family members may be the first to recognize the signs that their veteran needs help, but they may lack the knowledge of how to approach the situation.
- 3. There are several innovative programs either funded by the government or private non-governmental organizations that help veterans in crisis, but they often lack funding or broad-based visibility.
- 4. Veteran service organizations, like The American Legion, provide a well-established peer support network that is ready, willing, and able to help in local communities.
- 5. The Legion is also willing to explore partnerships with other like-minded organizations where the opportunity exists to amplify and/or complements one another's strengths.





6 Basic Computer Tricks to Make Life Easier

At this point, most of the general public should know how to use a computer in the most basic of situations. Turn it on. Open up the internet. Write a document. Print something. If you expect to be somewhat successful or, at the very least, considered a normal functioning human being, computer knowhow is simply a must. If you're adamant about sticking to the basics and you don't feel the need to make 'geek' your second language, then here are a few tricks to make you more efficient in the land of computers. And even if you do consider yourself to be above the basics or somewhat of a computer aficionado, some of these tips might be new and rather useful for you.

CTRL + BKSP

If you need to delete one whole word, hold down CTRL and Backspace simultaneously. To delete multiple words, hold down the CTRL button and continue to tap on the Backspace button until you've deleted everything that needs to go away.

CTRL + W

When you have multiple internet sites open at once, you can close one at a time by holding down CTRL and W. This action will cause the tab you are currently on to close and will send you back to the next open tab – no magnifying glass and little 'X' button required.

CTRL + L

Again, if you're not willing to reach for your mouse, this trick is incredibly useful. Hold down CTRL and L to highlight the address bar. You can immediately begin typing to go to a new website.

Windows + D

If you need all programs minimized – including the program you're currently on – then hit Windows and D. This will bring you back to the desktop. Hit CTRL D to go back to it.

CTRL + T

When you're on the internet and you need to open up a new tab, hold down CTRL and T. This trick will get you there quicker.

Windows + L

This is a great tip for anyone, anywhere to use. Whenever you leave your computer, hit WINDOWS and L to lock it. Hopefully, you have some sort of pass-code protecting your device...if not, *shame on you!*


