2023 Legion Baseball Regionals: Sunday Roundup

Seven of the eight teams for the 96th American Legion World Series were determined on Sunday and the final spot will be claimed after a suspended game is resumed at 8:30 a.m. Monday morning.

Defending champion Troy, Ala. leads the field that includes all-time leading ALWS participant Brooklawn, N.J.; Post 72 will be making its 17th appearance in the event and first since 2015.

Florence, S.C.; Lincoln, Neb.; and League City, Texas, have made previous ALWS appearances while there are two first-time participants in **Ellsworth, Maine** and Cheyenne, Wyo. – the first team ever from Wyoming to reach the ALWS.

The final spot will be claimed from the Great Lakes Regional as Midland, Mich., led Cedar Rapids, Iowa, 1-0 in the fourth inning of their rain-delayed contest. A Midland victory would force a "winner-take-all" Game 15 of the regional while a Cedar Rapids victory would give it the region championship, as the Iowa team has yet to lose in the double-elimination tournament.

The American Legion, Department of Maine has a long history with the Maine Veterans' Cemeteries across the State. In 1960, The American Legion learned of a plan for joint State-Federal cemeteries, by State Convention in 1962 (in Old Orchard Beach), a resolution was passed attested by Department Adjutant Nathaniel Cobb. The resolution was to establish a Legion committee at the Maine Veterans Cemetery in Augusta since the burial space at Togus was closed. The Committee was tasked with finding land, deciding on building designs, placing flag poles, deciding on marker types, and working on getting legislation passed to support this massive project.

Fast forward to 2023- A chapel that had stood at the well-established cemetery fell into disrepair and was torn down years ago. The committal building that replaced it is heavily utilized and in need of some massive structural renovations. The committal building is an essential tool needed to conduct an interment service for our fallen comrades.

Commander McKay states "This is a very muchneeded building to provide a dignified space for our veterans, their spouses, and their families. The building renovations will allow protection from the elements yearround and ensure The American Legion, continuing with their Maine Veterans Memorial Cemetery history, remains a frontrunner in honoring all veterans who enter Post Everlasting".

A LIFELONG COMMITMENT TO POW/MIAS OF THE VIETNAM WAR

For over 45 years, this week's <u>special guest on The American Legion Tango Alpha Lima podcast</u> has been helping to ensure a full accounting and identification for all American POW/MIAs of the Vietnam War. The issue is personal to Ann Mills-Griffiths, chairman of the Board for the National League of POW/MIA Families.

On Sept. 21, 1966, Mills-Griffiths' brother was listed as MIA. The Navy F4B on which Cmdr. James B. Mills served on disappeared over North Vietnam. He was on his second tour, assigned to Fighter Squadron 21, USS Coral Sea.

"When you talk about honoring and remembering people, the ultimate honor and ability to remember is to do our best and honor our commitment to those who served our country and do our best to bring them home if they're captured or missing," said Mills-Griffiths, a member of American Legion Auxiliary Unit 364 in Virginia.

The National League of POW/MIA Families was founded in 1970 with a mission "for the return of all

POWs, the fullest possible accounting for the MIAs, and the recovery and identification of the remains of those who died serving our nation during the Vietnam War." Mills-Griffiths' father was the executive director of the National League of POW/MIA Families in 1974 for one year until he was diagnosed with Leukemia. After that, she "took over the reins for my family, and it ended up being a lifelong commitment for me."

Through her commitment, Mills-Griffiths represents POW/MIA families through direct contacts with United States and foreign leaders. She has met with senior officials in Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia, as well as with Thai, Russian, Chinese and other diplomats and senior officials in an effort to expedite answers and accounting for POW/MIAs.

"Anything like that that you can do to show your support for our military, for those who serve our nation, I think is extremely important to do," Mills-Griffiths said.

The National League of POW/MIA Families works alongside veteran service organizations like The American Legion to support its mission. "Today, those who do the accounting for the Vietnam War has expanded because of our efforts, including the Legion and all of our VSO (veteran service organization) colleagues," she said, adding that it's important for Legion members to continue supporting legislation and advocating for the accounting of America's POW/MIAs and to fly the POW/MIA flag as a reminder to all of the service and sacrifice of military men and women.

At 82 years young, Mills-Griffiths said, "I have to write a book. When you've been alive and been involved for this many years on an issue that is still very much ongoing and impacts our military and those serving today, you can't just walk out and leave it." The title of her book will be "In Search of a Brother."

In 2018, her brother's remains were recovered and brought home. "He did come back. I never thought it would happen," Mills-Griffiths said. Listen to the podcast to hear how his accounting for is "really a miracle story."

Co-hosts Jeff Daly and Ashley Gutermuth also riff on:

- A North Carolina woman who has helped 1,000 homeless veterans by using her outfitted Jeep to provide mobile showers, laundry services and meals.
- VA facing a growing number of claims as a PACT Act deadline approaches.







National Agent Orange Awareness Day is August 10

Agent Orange exposure and VA disability compensation If a Veteran has a health condition caused by exposure to the herbicide Agent Orange during their service, they may be eligible for VA disability compensation. Compensation provides tax-free monthly payments. Keep reading to find out if they may be eligible.

Is the Veteran eligible for VA disability compensation based on Agent Orange exposure? The Veteran may be eligible for VA disability compensation based on Agent Orange exposure if he/she meets both of these requirements. Both of these must be true:

- They have a health condition that's caused by exposure to Agent Orange, and
- They served in a location that exposed them to Agent Orange

Note: If the Veteran gets a disability rating, they may also be eligible for VA health care and other benefits.

Locations: We assume Veterans who served in certain locations were exposed to Agent Orange. We refer to this as presumptive exposure. Vietnam, Blue Water Navy/12-Nautical Miles, Thailand, Royal Thai Base, Laos, Cambodia at Mimot or Krek; Kampong Cham Province, Guam, American Samoa, or the territorial waters thereof, Johnston Atoll or on a ship that called at Johnston Atoll.

Presumptive Conditions: We consider a condition presumptive when it's established by law or regulation. If a Veteran has been diagnosed with one of these conditions, they don't need to prove that it started during—or got worse be-cause of their military service. AL amyloidosis; chloracne or other acneform disease consistent with chlor-acne; bladder cancer; type 2 diabetes (also known as type II diabetes mellitus or adult-onset diabetes); Hodgkin's disease; hypothyroidism; ischemic heart disease; all chronic B-cell leukemias (including but not limited to, hairy-cell leukemia and chronic lymphocytic leukemia); multiple myeloma; non-Hodgkin's lymphoma; Parkinson's disease; parkinsonism; early-onset peripheral neuropathy; porphyria cutanea tarda (PCT); prostate cancer; respiratory cancers; hypertension; monoclonal gammopathy of undetermined sig-nificance (MGUS); and soft-tissue sarcoma (other than osteosarcoma, chondrosarcoma, Kaposi's sar-coma, or mesothelioma). PCT, chloracne, and early-onset peripheral neuropathy.

How can a you file a claim? Veterans must complete VA Form 21-526EZ to apply for benefits, or VA Form 21-0995 if previously denied or submit an Intent to File (ITF), on VA Form 21-0966. "Veterans may file claims for free online at www.va.gov, or work with one of the five Veterans "Service Organizations for free that are located on the Togus campus (American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Maine Veterans' Services, Paralyzed Veterans of American and Veterans of Foreign Wars). Veterans may also schedule a free in-person or virtual appointment to meet directly with a Togus representative using a self-service portal at https://vets.force.com/VAVERA/s. If Mainers have questions about benefits or are having challenges with the self-service tool, please call 207-621-6938.

If a Veteran was previously denied a claim, what can they do? VA will contact Veterans when a presumption of service connection is established or changed. However, Veterans previously denied a toxic-exposure related claim are encouraged to file a supplemental claim. Once a supplemental claim is received, VA will review the claim under the new law.
