EXEMPTORGANIZATIONS E-FILE-E-POSTCARD

What is the electronic filing requirement for small tax-exempt organizations?

Beginning in 2008, small tax-exempt organizations that previously were not required to file returns may be required to submit an annual electronic notice, Form 990-N, Electronic Notice (e-Postcard) for Tax-Exempt Organizations not Required To File Form 990 or 990-EZ. This filing requirement applies to tax periods beginning after December 31, 2006. Organizations that fail to meet their annual filing requirement for threeconsecutive years are subject to losing their tax-exempt status.

Small tax-exempt organizations, whose gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less, are not required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax, or Form 990-EZ, Short Form Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax. These small tax-exempt organizations are required to file electronically the e-Postcard, Form 990-N, with the IRS annually. Exceptions to this requirement include organizations that are included in a group return, private foundations required to file Form 990-PF, and section 509(a)(3) supporting organizations required to file Form 990 or Form 990-EZ. In addition, this filingrequirement does not apply to churches, their integrated auxiliaries, and conventions or associations of churches.

SCHOOL ORATORICAL SCHOLARSHIP CONTEST

The American Legion, Department of Maine High School Oratorical Scholarship Contest will once again be held at Thomas College in Waterville on February 12, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. Snow Date: February 19, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.

The main purpose of The American Legion Oratorical Contest "A Constitutional Speech Contest" is to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Other objectives of the contest include the development of leadership qualities, the ability to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and the preparation for acceptance of the duties, responsibilities, the rights and privileges of American citizenship.

Young orators will have the opportunity to earn some of the most generous scholarships. At the Post and District level, scholarships offered range from \$50 - \$100, and at the State level \$50 - \$1500. At the National level, each department (state) winner who is certified and participates in the National Oratorical Contest's 1st round receives \$2,000 scholarship. Each first round winner who advances to and participates in the second round, but does not advance to the final round, will receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship to pursue education beyond high school. The overall national contest winner gets an \$25,000 scholarship. Second place takes home \$22,500, and third gets \$20,000. The members of the Oratorical Committee will be working with both Area and District Commanders to prepare Posts and Districts for their local contests. We hope to have all Post contests completed by Mid-December 2021 and all District contests completed by the end of January 2022.

The 2022 **National Finals is April 22-24** in Indianapolis, at the Wyndham Indianapolis West. Quarterfinal and semifinal contests are scheduled for Saturday, April 23, with the finals scheduled for Sunday, April 24. <u>Certification of Department winners is due to National by March 14, 2022.</u>

Did you know that: The Original proposed Bill of Rights contained 12 Rights not 10?

Did you know that: James Madison, author of the Bill of Rights, used the Magna Carta (1215),

English Bill of Rights (1689) and the Virginia Declaration of Rights (1776) in writing the proposed amendments to the Constitution.

Did you know that: The Constitution was finally ratified by all 14 States in January 1791, the last being Vermont.

Did you know that: A proposed Bill of Rights Amendment submitted in 1789 was not officially ratified until 1992 and became the 26th Amendment?

I didn't know any of these things, plus a whole lot more, until I attended our Post Oratorical Contest, the District Oratorical Contest and the State Oratorical Contest.

The students who research and present their Prepared Speech and Assigned Topics will amaze you by how much time and effort they have spent rehearsing and polishing their presentations.

I hope to see you at the Oratorical Finals, for I am sure, I will learn even more about the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights again this year at the Post, District and State Finals.

Top 10 Tips and Tricks For Using Microsoft Word

Copy, Paste and Cut with Keyboard Shortcuts

Ask anyone who knows these shortcuts, Ctrl + C to copy, Ctrl + V to paste, and Ctrl + X to cut and they will vouch for their basic timesaving nature.

Rapidly Zoom In or Out

Use the Window > Zoom (newer versions, Format > Zoom), or search for the "100%" tab with a slider at the bottom right of the document to zoom in or out.

Delete Entire Words at a Time

Hold down Backspace to remove words or entire sentences, press Ctrl+Backspace with the cursor set after a word you want to remove a word at a time.

Smart Lookup

Right-click on a word, you'll see "Lookup" or "Search", with a magnifying glass. Click on it and you'll get a definition of the word.

Remove Unwanted Formatting

Press Ctrl + Space or click the Clear All Formatting button. In newer versions, an eraser on the Home tab) to remove formatting from highlighted text.

Use Multiple clicks to Select Text

Double-click over a word to select it or triple-click to select an entire sentence or paragraph.

Rapidly Insert Links into a Document

Like the copy/paste/cut directions, taking in the keyboard shortcut for adding web links to a document, Ctrl + K will spare loads of time and rapidly become one of the keenest tools in your pack.

Select the Default Font you Want

Choose your default font for all new documents by clicking Format > Font, select the properties you want, and after that click Default.

Find Words or Text


Click Ctrl + F or click on Search in Document menu to find words or text in a document.
