The Taliban are retaking control of Afghanistan at an alarming rate. It's something generations of veterans have seen. A similar takeover occurred in Iraq. And we all know what happened in Vietnam. As a Vietnam veteran, I deeply empathize with today's veterans who are witnessing this tragic turn of events.

But let me be 100 percent clear — the sacrifice, commitment and work by all of our men and women in uniform these past 20 years was worth it.

They kept our nation safe when many feared another attack.

They brought evil-doers to justice.

They delivered hope to war-torn nations.

Their courage, victories and selfless acts of service will not be washed away by history.

To all the men and women who served and made the world a better, safer and brighter place since the dark day of 9/11, I salute you.

As veterans, we have a unique perspective on what all of this means. The action we are seeing today is troubling on an international scale. But also troubling to veterans, especially those who served with honor since 9/11. They may be left questioning what all of this means. They may have trouble processing this turn of events as related to their service. They may experience feelings of depression.

But we need to let them know that their service matters today and it will matter tomorrow.

# What is the electronic filing requirement for small tax-exempt organizations?

**B** eginning in 2008, small tax-exempt organizations that previously were not required to file returns may be required to submit an annual electronic notice, Form 990-N, *Electronic Notice* (*e-Postcard*) for Tax-Exempt Organizations not Required To File Form 990 or 990-EZ. This filing requirement applies to tax periods beginning after December 31, 2006. Organizations that fail to meet their annual filing requirement for threeconsecutive years are subject to losing their tax-exempt status.

Small tax-exempt organizations, whose gross receipts are normally \$50,000 or less, are not required to file Form 990, *Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax*, or Form 990-EZ, *Short Form Return of Organization Exempt From Income Tax*. These small tax-exempt organizations are required to file electronically the e-Postcard, Form 990-N, with the IRS annually. Exceptions to this requirement include organizations that are included in a group return, private foundations required to file Form 990-PF, and section 509(a)(3) supporting organizations required to file Form 990 or Form 990-EZ. In addition, this filingrequirement does not apply to churches, their integrated auxiliaries, and conventions or associations of churches.

# <u>The American Legion, Department of Maine</u> High School Oratorical Scholarship Program

The American Legion, Department of Maine High School Oratorical Scholarship Contest will once again be held at Thomas College in Waterville on February 12, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. Snow Date: February 19, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.

The main purpose of The American Legion Oratorical Contest "A Constitutional Speech Contest" is to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Other objectives of the contest include the development of leadership qualities, the ability to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and the preparation for acceptance of the duties, responsibilities, the rights and privileges of American citizenship.

Young orators will have the opportunity to earn some of the most generous scholarships. At the Post and District level, scholarships offered range from \$50 - \$100, and at the State level \$50 - \$1500. At the National level, each department (state) winner who is certified and participates in the National Oratorical Contest's 1<sup>st</sup> round receives \$2,000 scholarship. Each first round winner who advances to and participates in the second round, but does not advance to the final round, will receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship to pursue education beyond high school. The overall national contest winner gets an \$25,000 scholarship. Second place takes home \$22,500, and third gets \$20,000. The members of the Oratorical Committee will be working with both Area and District Commanders to prepare Posts and Districts for their local contests. We hope to have all Post contests completed by Mid-December 2021 and all District contests completed by the end of January 2022.

The 2022 National Finals is April 22-24 in Indianapolis, at the Wyndham Indianapolis West. Quarterfinal and semifinal contests are scheduled for Saturday, April 23, with the finals scheduled for Sunday, April 24. <u>Certification of Department</u> winners is due to National by March 14, 2022.

Did you know that: The Constitution was finally ratified by all 14 States in January 1791, the last being Vermont.

Did you know that: A proposed Bill of Rights Amendment submitted in 1789 was not officially ratified until 1992 and became the 26th Amendment?

I didn't know any of these things, plus a whole lot more, until I attended our Post Oratorical Contest, the District Oratorical Contest and the State Oratorical Contest.

The students who research and present their Prepared Speech and Assigned Topics will amaze you by how much time and effort they have spent rehearsing and polishing their presentations.

I hope to see you at the Oratorical Finals, for I am sure, I will learn even more about the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights again this year at the Post, District and State Finals.

# AMERICAN LEGION FREQUENTLY USED TERMS (A-B)

adjutant: Do not abbreviate.

**administration:** Lowercase: the president's administration, the Eisenhower administration.

adviser: Not advisor.

attorney general: Do not abbreviate.

**amendment:** Capitalize when referring to a numbered amendment: the 27th Amendment, the proposed flag amendment, a constitutional amendment.

American Legion, The: Always use The American Legion on first reference, capitalizing the "t." May use the Legion on second reference. Do not abbreviate TAL.

American Legion Auxiliary: Also referred to as the Legion Auxiliary or the Auxiliary. Do not abbreviate ALA.

American Legion Baseball: ALB acceptable on second reference.

American Legion Extension Institute: ALEI acceptable on second reference.

American Legion Family: Refers to the family of American Legion organizations: The American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, Sons of The American Legion, and the American Legion Riders.

American Legion Magazine, The: The American Legion Magazine in all references.

American Legion National Headquarters: Do not abbreviate American Legion National HQ. Call American Legion National Headquarters in Indianapolis to distinguish from The American Legion's Washington, D.C., office.

American Legion World Series: ALWS acceptable on second reference.

Army, Navy, Air Force Veterans in Canada-United States: ANAVICUS on second reference.

**armed forces:** Do not capitalize unless U.S. Armed Forces.

**Article:** Do not abbreviate when referring to a section of a constitution.

assistant: Do not abbreviate the word or title.

blog, blog entry, blog post

**Board of Veterans Appeals:** BVA acceptable on second reference.

**Boys Nation:** No apostrophe. American Legion Boys Nation preferred.

**Boys State:** No apostrophe. American Legion Boys State preferred, or department-specific name: American Legion Buckeye Boys State, Hoosier Boys State. Participants are Boys Staters.
