WWII POW/MIA VETERAN U.S. ARMY AIR FORCE 2ND LT. ERNEST N. VIENNEAU

On Saturday October 9th at 10:30am, at St. Martin's Catholic Church, 19 Colby St., in Millinocket the Nation and Maine will lay to rest a WWII POW/MIA Veteran U.S. Army Air Force 2nd Lt. Ernest N. Vienneau that has been lost to all since 1944.

Lt. Vienneau was a co-pilot attached to the 340th Bombardment Squadron, 97 Bombardment Group, 15th Air Force, stationed in Amendola, Italy. The B-17 Flying Fortress Bomber was on a mission over Maribor, Yugoslavia when it was it by fire. Lt. Vienneau was killed instantly by shrapnel. The pilot was forced to down the plane off the coast of Vis Island, Croatia. All ten of the members of the crew survived this day. Lt. Vienneau's body was never recovered.

April 16, 2021, Lt Vienneau's remains were recovered. He will be buried with Full Military Honors with a flyover on October 9th. The American Legion Riders will escort Lt. Ernest Vienneau to his final resting place in Millinocket. American Legion Riders are asked to meet at American Legion Post 80 in Millinocket and then will go to the funeral home together for 9:45am. The funeral will be at St. Martin's Catholic Church at 10:30am.

American Legion Post 80 will hold a luncheon at the post following the burial.

"This will be an honor that we may never see again in our lifetime, to welcome home a POW/MIA" said Rick Cyr Jr. ALR Chapter 80 Director.

TOMB OF THE UNKNOWN SOLDIER WAS GUARDED BY AN ALL-WOMAN TEAM FOR THE FIRST TIME EVER!

The Tomb of the Unknown Soldier was recently guarded by an all-woman team of three sentinels for the first time in history. "History was made" at Arlington National Cemetery, said Col. Patrick Roddy, commander of the <u>3rd U.S. Infantry Regiment</u> (Old Guard), the Army's official ceremonial unit and escort to the president, in a post on Twitter. "For the first time in the 84-year vigil, on the 30,770th day of the continuous guard, an all-woman changing of the guard occurred under the direction of the 38th Sergeant of the Guard, SFC Porterfield."

<u>The American Legion, Department of Maine</u> High School Oratorical Scholarship Program

The American Legion, Department of Maine High School Oratorical Scholarship Contest will once again be held at Thomas College in Waterville on February 12, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. Snow Date: February 19, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.

The main purpose of The American Legion Oratorical Contest "A Constitutional Speech Contest" is to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Other objectives of the contest include the development of leadership qualities, the ability to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and the preparation for acceptance of the duties, responsibilities, the rights and privileges of American citizenship.

Young orators will have the opportunity to earn some of the most generous scholarships. At the Post and District level, scholarships offered range from \$50 - \$100, and at the State level \$50 - \$1500. At the National level, each department (state) winner who is certified and participates in the National Oratorical Contest's 1st round receives \$2,000 scholarship. Each first round winner who advances to and participates in the second round, but does not advance to the final round, will receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship to pursue education beyond high school. The overall national contest winner gets an \$25,000 scholarship. Second place takes home \$22,500, and third gets \$20,000. The members of the Oratorical Committee will be working with both Area and District Commanders to prepare Posts and Districts for their local contests. We hope to have all Post contests completed by Mid-December 2021 and all District contests completed by the end of January 2022.

The 2022 National Finals is April 22-24 in Indianapolis, at the Wyndham Indianapolis West. Quarterfinal and semifinal contests are scheduled for Saturday, April 23, with the finals scheduled for Sunday, April 24. <u>Certification of Department</u> winners is due to National by March 14, 2022.



If you receive this notice from "US Domain Authority", toss it in the trash!

This notice can easily be mistaken as a bill to renew your domain registration. In reality, as "US Domain Authority" makes clear on a second page, they're not domain registrars at all. Instead, they're a directory service, sort of like 20th Century phone books were directories for phone numbers. All you get for your \$289.00 is your domain name added to their directory. The disclaimer indicates on the back page, that "This is not a bill. This is a solicitation. You are under no obligation to pay the amount stated above unless you accept this offer."

MILITARY TRIVIA:

A. In 1942 the Japanese attacked the USS Vicennes, but the original shell damage igniting the onboard aircraft, was not fatal to the ship. However, the resulting fire grew out of control by burning so many flammable items, which had been either built into the ship or brought on board, that it caused it to lose power & became a target for the 2 torpedoes that sank her with the loss of 300+ lives. Two years later, Wilton Dinges, with help from Alcoa, had designed a 7 lb. aluminum chair, for which he won a Naval contract by throwing it out an 8 story Chicago building to prove it's durability & the "10-06" was born, but in today's price at \$595/chair....just a bit expensive.



Computer 101 is a resource which aims to help those who wish to learn basic skills with the powerful technology of today's world. Increased proficiency with computers and the Internet has positive outcome across all fronts, both personally and professionally.

The History of the Computer Mouse

The mouse was invented by Douglas Engelbart in 1964 and consisted of a wooden shell, circuit board and two metal wheels that came into contact with the surface it was being used on.

It was eight years later in 1972 that Bill English developed the design further by inventing what is known as the "Ball Mouse" that we know today. The ball replaced the wheels and was capable of monitoring movement in any direction. The ball came into contact with two rollers that in turn spun wheels with graduations on them that could be turned into electrical pulses representing direction and speed.

At the time Bill English was working for Xerox Parc (Palo Alto Research Centre) the research and development centre set-up by Xerox to 'design the future of computing'. The mouse became part of the ground breaking Xerox Alto computer system which was the first minicomputer system to offer a graphical user interface.

It would be another 8 years before the mouse would be developed any further. An optical mouse was developed in around 1980, eliminating the ball which often became dirty from rolling round the desktop, negatively affecting its operation. However, they were far too expensive to be used widely. In fact it wasn't until around 1998 with the increase in microcontroller processing power and the reduction in component costs that optical mice became a commercially viable alternative to the ball mouse and infiltrated the mass consumer market.

Today the optical mouse has completely replaced the ball mouse being supplied as standard with all new computers.

- Download podcasts on your iPhone app: If you don't already have the Podcast app on your phone, first go to the App Store on your iPhone, browse to the Podcasts app and tap the "Free" button to install.
- Once the Podcast app is on your phone, open it and search for Tango Alpha Lima. Tap the logo and then hit the "Subscribe" button. When the download is complete, the most recent episode appears in the "My Podcasts" section of the Podcasts app. Tap the title to listen to it. You can also click on "See All Episodes" to download and listen to earlier episodes.
- **Download podcasts using iTunes:** Another • option is to download podcasts in the iTunes app on your computer and sync them to your iPhone. Open the iTunes store on your computer, browse to the podcast you want to download and click the "Free" button to download it. Click "Subscribe" to subscribe to the podcast and automatically download all future episodes.
- Download podcasts on an Android device: First, choose a Podcast app you want to use and download it from an Android App Store. Once downloaded, open the app and use search to locate "Tango Alpha Lima." From there you can subscribe to it and new episodes will be delivered automatically.

New Space Force Uniforms Vaccines and Veterans Suicide

488TH DEPLOYED TO SOUTHERN BOARDER. GUARDIAN RIDE

Oortland Governor Janet Mills and Commissioner **I** of the Maine Department of Defense, Veterans and Emergency Management Major General Douglas Farnham today thanked the 488th Military Police Company for their service and wished them a safe deployment to the Southwest border.

The unit's approximately 120 service members, who are deploying under federal Title 10 mobilization orders, departed Maine today to provide support to U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). The Governor and Adjutant General saw them off at the Portland International Jetport.

"Throughout our history, dedicated members of Maine's armed services have answered the call of duty, deploying to places near and far to serve our state and nation," said Governor Mills. "On behalf of Maine people, I offer our thanks to the 488th for again stepping up to serve. We wish you a safe deployment and look forward to welcoming you home."

Members of the 488th were on standby near the Maine State House at the time of the Inauguration in January and also provided protection to the U.S. Capitol for several weeks after the inaugural events. Now tasked with their third mission in 2021, which will last one year, the 488th will be primarily monitoring mobile and remote video surveillance camera systems to provide real-time situational awareness to CBP agents.

This is a federal Title 10 unit mobilization under the direction of the U.S. Department of Defense. The 262nd Engineer Company has been conducting a similar mission on the Southwest border since this time last year. That mission will conclude this fall.

"From regular operations and COVID response here in Maine, to domestic support in Washington, to overseas support in Africa, and now a continuation of the Southwest border mission, our Soldiers and Airmen are always willing to serve." said Maj. Gen. Farnham. "We are proud of the National Guard's ability to respond to varying missions, which would not be possible without the support of family members, friends, and the flexibility of employers across the State of Maine." 8

 - Have moderate to severe immune compromise, <u>as defined by the Centers for Disease</u> <u>Control and Prevention (CDC)</u>, and received either Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccines.
