LEGION MOURNS PASSING OF COLIN POWELL

A merican Legion National Commander Paul E. Dillard expressed condolences today concerning the passing of former Secretary of State Colin Powell.

Powell was recognized by The American Legion in 1993, with the organization's highest award, the Distinguished Service Medal. As chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, Gen. Powell addressed delegates at the 72nd National Convention of The American Legion in 1990.

"While our values have nurtured us, our power has protected us," Powell told The American Legion. "Purpose and power, it's an unbeatable combination, one that fascism could not destroy, one that communism could not defeat, one that has always been ready to meet aggression."

Dillard added today that Powell's leadership will be missed. "Colin Powell was not only a general, but a statesman and leader in every sense. He was a groundbreaker in so many ways," Dillard said. "Not only was he the first Black chairman of the Joint Chiefs of Staff, but he was also America's National Security Advisor as the Cold War ended. He served with distinction in Republican and Democratic administrations. We extend our condolences to his family and many friends. America is better because of his service."

The American Legion, Department of Maine High School Oratorical Scholarship Contest will once again be held at Thomas College in Waterville on February 12, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. Snow Date: February 19, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.

The main purpose of The American Legion Oratorical Contest "A Constitutional Speech Contest" is to develop a deeper knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. Other objectives of the contest include the development of leadership qualities, the ability to think and speak clearly and intelligently, and the preparation for acceptance of the duties, responsibilities, the rights and privileges of American citizenship.

Young orators will have the opportunity to earn some of the most generous scholarships. At the Post and District level, scholarships offered range from \$50 - \$100, and at the State level \$50 - \$1500. At the National level, each department (state) winner who is certified and participates in the National Oratorical Contest's 1st round receives \$2,000 scholarship. Each first round winner who advances to and participates in the second round, but does not advance to the final round, will receive an additional \$2,000 scholarship to pursue education beyond high school. The overall national contest winner gets an \$25,000 scholarship. Second place takes home \$22,500, and third gets \$20,000. The members of the Oratorical Committee will be working with both Area and District Commanders to prepare Posts and Districts for their local contests. We hope to have all Post contests completed by Mid-December 2021 and all District contests completed by the end of January 2022.

The 2022 National Finals is April 22-24 in Indianapolis, at the Wyndham Indianapolis West. Quarterfinal and semifinal contests are scheduled for Saturday, April 23, with the finals scheduled for Sunday, April 24. <u>Certification of Department</u> winners is due to National by March 14, 2022.

Did you know that: The Constitution was finally ratified by all 14 States in January 1791, the last being Vermont.

Did you know that: A proposed Bill of Rights Amendment submitted in 1789 was not officially ratified until 1992 and became the 26th Amendment?

I didn't know any of these things, plus a whole lot more, until I attended our Post Oratorical Contest, the District Oratorical Contest and the State Oratorical Contest.

The students who research and present their Prepared Speech and Assigned Topics will amaze you by how much time and effort they have spent rehearsing and polishing their presentations.

I hope to see you at the Oratorical Finals, for I am sure, I will learn even more about the U.S. Constitution and the Bill of Rights again this year at the Post, District and State Finals.

A. In 1777, 90% of the Continental Army Regulars' deaths were caused by disease & not enemy action, so George Washington, after writing to Dr. William Shippen Jr., learned that there was a vaccine which would prevent the spread of the most infectious "Variola" variety of the smallpox disease, the biggest killer of all.

Computer 101 is a resource which aims to help those who wish to learn basic skills with the powerful technology of today's world. Increased proficiency with computers and the Internet has positive outcome across all fronts, both personally and professionally.

Translate

Use Word's **"Translate"** feature to read and write in foreign languages. To translate text to another language, all you have to do is select the text, rightclick, and tap "Translate" in Word. The Translator panel will show the text, then you can select the language you want to translate it to.

You can then place the translated text into the document with "Insert."

Word won't write your Spanish essay for you, but it can help with on-the-fly translations.

Add Filler Placeholder Text Anywhere

Let's say that you want to check how a font looks, or how to format certain pages, but don't have any writing to test with. This is where **Lorem Ipsum** comes in.

Lorem Ipsum is filler text — nonsense words and sentences that are structured exactly like actual words and sentences. If you just need text as a placeholder, Lorem Ipsum is perfect for the job.

Click the spot on the page where you want the filler text and type **=Lorem()** then hit Enter:

By default, it'll give you five paragraphs of text. You can type a number in the parentheses to specify how many paragraphs you want.

Once the Lorem Ipsum appears, you can edit, format, and move it like any other text. Filler text is a great way to keep working on a document if you need to format text that doesn't exist yet.

Use Smart Search to look up words and topics without leaving Word. Word offers a way to look up information that won't require you to navigate the winding, endless roads of Bing or Google.

All you have to do to use the smart search feature is highlight the word or phrase you want to look up, right-click it and select "Search." A sidebar will appear giving you the top search results.

Also known as "Smart Lookup," this can save you from switching back-and-forth between apps.

TEN THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE NAVY

The U.S. Navy celebrates its birthday on Oct. 13. In 1775, a naval force was established by the Continental Congress to aid in the conflict with the British.

Here are some things you might not know about the Navy.

- 1. Five cities claim the right to be considered the Navy's birthplace: Beverly, Mass.; Marblehead, Mass.; Philadelphia; Whitehall, N.Y.; and Providence, Rhode Island. The Navy takes no position on its place of origin.
- 2. All submariners are volunteers who have passed rigorous psychological and physical tests.
- 3. Navy ships named for individuals are christened by "the eldest living female descendent" of that individual.
- 4. Humphrey Bogart, Bob Barker and MC Hammer all served in the Navy.
- 5. Bill the Goat has been the Naval Academy mascot since the early 1900s. Legend has it that a Navy ship once had a goat for a pet, and on the way home to port the goat died. Two ensigns were entrusted to have the goat stuffed, but got distracted by a Naval Academy football game. One of the ensigns allegedly dressed up in the goat skin and pranced around at halftime. The crowd loved it and Navy won the game.
- 6. The first version of the Navy was dissolved following the Revolutionary War, but it was reconstituted to deal with piracy.
- 7. During World War II, the Navy produced six future presidents: Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon, Ford, Carter and Bush Sr. And before the war, there had been no naval veterans in the White House.
- 8. Cadets and midshipmen played the first Army-Navy football game Nov. 29, 1890, on "The Plain" at West Point. Navy had been playing organized football since 1879 and defeated the newly established Army team 24-0.
- The Blue Angels the Navy's flight exhibition team – was established in 1946 by Chief of Naval Operations Adm. Chester Nimitz to raise the public's interest in naval aviation and boost Navy morale.
- 10. The Navy Marine Mammal Program trains bottlenose dolphins and California sea lions to detect, locate, mark and recover objects in harbors, coastal areas, and at depth in the open sea.
