The American Legion, Department of Maine has a long history with the Maine Veterans' Cemeteries across the State. In 1960, The American Legion learned of a plan for joint State-Federal cemeteries, by State Convention in 1962 (in Old Orchard Beach), a resolution was passed attested by Department Adjutant Nathaniel Cobb. The resolution was to establish a Legion committee at the Maine Veterans Cemetery in Augusta since the burial space at Togus was closed. The Committee was tasked with finding land, deciding on building designs, placing flag poles, deciding on marker types, and working on getting legislation passed to support this massive project.

Fast forward to 2023 - A chapel that had stood at the well-established cemetery fell into disrepair and was torn down years ago. The committal building that replaced it is heavily utilized and in need of some massive structural renovations. The committal building is an essential tool needed to conduct an interment Service for our fallen comrades.

Commander McKay states "This is a very much-needed building to provide a dignified space for our veterans, their spouses, and their families. The building renovations will allow protection from the elements year-round and ensure The American Legion, continuing with their Maine Veterans Memorial Cemetery history, remains a frontrunner in honoring all veterans who enter Post Everlasting".

SEPTEMBER IMPACT: SHUTDOWN AVERTED

If You Hear This 4-Word Phrase When You Pick Up the Phone, Hang Up Immediately

If you've been getting more robocalls lately, you are not alone. [Phone call scams](#) have increased a whopping 118% in the past year, according to First Orion, and millions of Americans have fallen victim to phone scammers looking to steal their money and identities.

Hopefully, you've already learned not to answer calls from [these area codes](#) and know [how to tell if the "iPhone virus warning" is a scam](#). But now there's another common phone scam trick to watch out for. Experts are warning about a robocall that starts with the simple four-word phrase "Can you hear me?" in hopes of recording your response and using it to commit fraud.

Keeping these [iPhone privacy settings](#) up to date can boost your [smartphone security and privacy](#), but they might not protect you in this case. Luckily, we've got the scoop from experts on why this phone scam is so dangerous, what you should do if you respond and how to avoid falling victim in the future.

Why This Phone Scam is So Dangerous

In general, all phone scams "are designed to do two things: gain information about you that can be used to impersonate you [through] identity theft, and get you to give money to the scammer," says Adam Gordon, an instructor at ITProTV, which provides professional IT training.

In this particular phone scam, a recorded voice will ask, "Can you hear me?" when a victim answers the call. The phrase is designed to trick the victim into responding "yes," while the person or computer on the other end is recording. From there, the scammer can use the recording to access important online accounts, make purchases and commit fraud like identity theft. All they have to do is play the recording of your voice saying "yes" when asked to authorize a log-in or agree to a major purchase.

"This phone scam is particularly frightening [because] they simply rely on the human behavior of answering a quick question," says Matthew Shirley, director of offensive cybersecurity operations at Fortalice, a cybersecurity services company.

By getting right to the point, the scammer catches victims off guard and forces them to act fast before they have the chance to think rationally. Scams on [Uber](#) and [Facebook Marketplace](#) also rely on this strategy, so it's important stay vigilant across the board.

The Danger of Chatbots and AI

This phone scam also reveals the sneaky potential of new chatbots and [artificial intelligence \(AI\)](#) technology to imitate human speech. These days, "AI chatbots are so advanced that they give the 'human touch,' being able to masquerade as a human successfully in many cases, and can be indistinguishable from a human in situations like a phone call," Gordon says.

Unfortunately, scammers are now using this new technology to fool victims into believing they are speaking with a real person on the phone. In a new version of the "Can you hear me?" phone scam, the call begins with a human-like voice saying "Sorry, I'm having issues with my headset."

This tactic makes people think that a real person is on the other line. It also "gives a little room for interpretation of pacing," like odd delays, which would ordinarily tip off the victims that they might be dealing with a phone scam, Shirley says.

What Your Voice Saying "Yes" Can Unlock

With the recording of the victim's affirmation, scammers can access sensitive information, authorize payments or sign up for services that the victim doesn't want. "Just think about what someone with a recording of you saying 'yes' can attempt to access, unlock, change or authorize in today's remote-centric and faceless world," Gordon says. If the scammer is asked to agree to a purchase or service, for example, they will simply play the recording of your voice saying "yes."

That's why it is so important to protect your online accounts by creating [strong, unique passwords](#) and using [two-factor authentication](#) when you can.



At the end of the day, it's much easier to protect yourself from scammers than it is to recover a hacked Facebook account or hacked Instagram account.





A. Quite literally because of its shape being small & round. During a lecture in 1943, physicist Robert Serber used the word “bomb” and because the Manhattan Project was so secret, Project Director Robert Oppenheimer immediately sent an assistant to tell Serber NOT to use the “bomb” word, but to use “gadget” instead, because “gadget” was commonly used to describe many weapons being designed at that time. “Fat Man”, dropped on Nagasaki, was named “gun gadget” while “Little Boy”, dropped on Hiroshima, was named the “implosion gadget”, and ultimately called the “Trinity Device”, but they both served their purpose to bring the war to an abrupt end.

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) offers eligible Maine families up to \$30 a month off their internet bill.

Who qualifies for the Affordable Connectivity Program?

Eligibility is based on income. For example, a family of four making less than \$55,500 is eligible.

Mainers who participate in any of the following programs automatically qualify:

- Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC)
 - Supplemental Security Income (SSI)
- Most federal and state housing assistance programs
 - Veterans Pension and Survivors Benefit
- Free and Reduced-Price School Lunch Program
- Received a Federal Pell Grant in the current award year

SUPPORTING DIGITAL EQUITY (DE)

Supporting the development or employment of better Internet in a community goes hand in hand with Digital Equity (DE) and is one of its key elements. The Blue Hill Peninsula area group referenced as The PUB has a new domain name - www.pubfiber.org. Our **Mission Statement** (since forming in 2018) states: *“The Peninsula Utility for Broadband (PUB) advocates for fast, flexible, affordable and reliable internet to incentivize business, support schools, advance the quality of healthcare, connect homes and facilitate long term education and socialization of our rural communities.”*

Fidium Fiber became a reality for everyone who wants it in our area in March 2023, and our efforts will continue to ensure everyone knows just that, and why getting fiber makes sense over any other Internet service medium (Cable, Satellite, DSL, Hotspot...). Because of the Fidium Fiber price structure, it's also critically important to improve the awareness and use of the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP), raise the awareness of technology (i.e., Internet use and tools) through training opportunities, and the general benefits that access to the Internet brings for Education, Health Care, Connectivity with others and the other valuable benefits (i.e., Streaming and Phone) which are money saving and effective tools for everyone with good Internet access. Fiber is the gold standard and is used by every service – from satellites to cell phones. Fidium Fiber is the provider that brings it to your house! Not sure if you want to use it, you can try it for a month for free. For those that qualify, use your ACP benefit with any participating provider (your choice).

Do you have Fidium Fiber to your home? Do it! Can't afford the monthly access, or is there some other reason? Fiber based Internet access is symmetrical, futureproof, and available with no installation cost, and for those qualified, you **can** afford the monthly access because it's also free! Consider that if someone is on SNAP, Medicaid, or other benefit program - you can be qualified for the program. More than that (as an example) if you are a family of four making under \$60,000 you can qualify for a \$30/mo. discount at any service level but at the \$30/mo. for 50/50Mbps, it's free with the ACP discount. We want to keep the ACP program going and have you qualify - we can help. It really does matter, and we want you to use it, so we don't lose those funds! Remember too that no Internet Service Provider (ISP) can prequalify you and it is your family not your address that gets qualified.

Moving forward in Maine, we know that reaching out to food pantries, churches, and schools is vital in presenting a common well thought out voice, using tools such as those the Maine Connectivity Authority (MCA) has developed, and the resources the Maine based National Digital Equity Center (NDEC) provides to help educate - often for free. Reaching out to Veterans groups (local/state and national) and other national and local organizations with local ties and related interests will be happening on a larger scale in the entire state and specifically here.

Where do you go with questions and answers? The PUB site www.pubfiber.org can enable a local connection or a link to a resource for help and may provide answers to questions already addressed on the site. The Fidium Fiber website provides many more answers and proactively addresses many questions you may have on their fiber service at www.fidiumfiber.com. Calling, emailing, or texting local resources can address many more – or point you in the right direction.


