Tell Your Senators to Pass the STRONG Veterans Act

The STRONG Veterans Act (Support The Resiliency of Our Nation's Great Veterans Act) calls on the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) to designate a "National Buddy Check Week." It is modeled after The American Legion's successful Buddy Check program, which nearly 4,000 local posts a year have used to help veterans in need since 2019. It also includes dozens of provisions that come from standalone pieces of legislation The American Legion supports.

A Buddy Check Week designation is vital because it will be a concentrated effort, with the support of VA, to improve mental health outreach. That, of course, also ties in to the Legion's "Be the One" campaign to reduce the rate of veteran suicide.

The legislation promises to bring additional improvements to the mental health care of our nation's veterans. Those include:

- Funding research on veterans mental health & treatment.
- Making the Peer Specialist Support program permanent.
- Increasing full-time staffing at VA Vet Centers and expanding eligibility for treatment.
- Expanding existing scholarship and loan programs for students and mental health providers.

In June, the U.S. House of Representatives approved the measure in a bipartisan voice vote. It now awaits action in the Senate. With only a few months left in the 117th session of Congress, we cannot afford to let this opportunity to improve mental health care for veterans lapse. You can help prevent this from happening by urging your Senators to support H.R.6411 - the STRONG Veterans Act. It takes just a few moments by visiting this link.

The American Legion proudly supports this legislation, and asks that you call on your Senators to pass H.R. 6411 today!

NO-COST VA FLU SHOTS FOR ELIGIBLE VETERANS

It's time to get a flu shot!

Getting a flu shot protects you, your family and your community. If available, you can also safely receive your COVID Booster at the same time you get a flu shot — one visit, two vaccines. (For VA Maine locations, see table below.)

Flu Shots in Your Community:

Get a no-cost flu shot at a community provider in VA's network

Eligible Veterans can choose from one of nearly 70,000 <u>in-network</u> retail pharmacies and urgent care/walk-in locations to get their flu shot from **Sept. 1**, **2022**, **through April 30**, **2023**.

Who can get a flu shot at a community provider?

You are eligible to receive a flu shot at in-network retail pharmacy/urgent care if:

- You are enrolled in the VA health care system, AND,
- You received care from a VA provider or an in-network community care provider within the past 24 months

How do I know if I am eligible?

• Call 800-MyVA411 (800-698-2411) Select option 1 (urgent care information) Select option 3 (urgent care information) Select option 1 (check urgent care eligibility)

The system will verify your eligibility for the community urgent care benefit, which includes the flu vaccination.

Or call your local VA facility

• Your state may have age & health-related restrictions.

NOTE: Family members and beneficiaries are <u>not</u> eligible.

Where can I get a no-cost flu shot?

To locate a VA medical facility, in-network urgent care or retail pharmacy near you, use the <u>VA Locator</u>, here's how:

- Enter the city, state or postal ZIP code for your location.
- Choose a Facility Type from the drop down:
- Select VA health for VA medical center locations
- Select Urgent Care, for "All in-network urgent care"
- Select Community pharmacies (in VA's network)
- Click search
- Choose a provider

What Should I Know Before I Go?

Before you go:

• Call ahead to ensure the vaccine type you are seeking is available.

When you arrive:

- Tell the provider you are a Veteran enrolled in VA health care.
- Tell them you would like to receive the flu shot paid for by VA.
- Show your government-issued ID and the billing information flyer located above. (Print, take a screenshot or pull up this page at time of vaccine.)
- NO cost to you if your visit is **only** for a flu shot.
- You should not pay a copay if you **only** get a flu shot.

For assistance with in-network community flu shots, call 877-881-7618 or your local VA medical facility.

Who updates my medical records?

The community provider will send your flu shot vaccination documentation to VA or you can also request a copy of your flu shot documentation and provide it to your VA provider. (Please know a processing delay will occur in updating medical records.)

ICE Contacts In Case of Emergency



An ICE or 'In Case of Emergency' contact is a number or group of numbers that you designate in your phone to be called should you be in a crisis.

They are often called the Emergency Contacts. The valuable thing is that once an emergency contact is set, even if your phone is locked, you can simply select 'emergency call' to be able to see and call ICE numbers.

The Process of setting up your ICE contacts will depend on the type of phone you use. This article will concentrate on using an iOS device.

How to Set Up Medical ID in the Health App on Your iPhone

To make your important health information accessible in case of emergency (ICE) you should set up your medical ID in the Health app. To do this, tap Emergency SOS in your settings then open Set up Emergency Contacts in Health. In 'Health' tap Medical ID > Edit

Now you can enter your emergency contacts and health information.

Turn on **Show When Locked** to make your Medical ID available from the Locked screen. In emergency this gives people your important information and the emergency contacts that you

have entered. When you're finished tap Done.

How to Access Emergency ID or Make an Emergency Call:

To view the Medical ID, open the Health app and tap Medical ID. If the iPhone is locked, follow these steps:

- Press the **Home** button.
- Tap Emergency.

On the Emergency call screen, you can make a call or tap Medical ID to see ICE Contacts and any medical information stored on the device.

This accessibility is very important for emergency situations especially when your iPhone is locked.


Print 2023 Membership Cards in MyLegion
