The American Legion Riders have raised over 10 million dollars for the American Legion Legacy Fund.

The Riders are among the most generous and creative supporters of the American Legion Legacy Fund. Average amounts raised by Riders is over \$1,000,000 annually. Every penny is used for college scholarships for the children of fallen servicemen and women.

Riders participate in many functions including supporting needs in their communities, fundraisers for homeless veterans, for local charitable organizations such as children's hospitals, cancer camps scholarships, and toy runs for children of war casualties and the needy.

Riders provide escorts for military flights carrying our servicemen and women home to their families and loved ones as well as honoring them at there time of deployment..

American Legion Riders Honor Guards and ceremonial teams protect and honor the sanctity of veterans funerals, stand flag lines at memorial services and carry on the special bonds of the military service.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: When and where were The American Legion Riders Founded?

A: ALR started at the American Legion Post 396 in Garden City, Mich., in the fall of 1993. Members wanted to create an environment in which members of the Legion family could share a common love for motorcycle.

Q: How can I start an American Legion Rider Chapter at my Post?

A: Speak with your Post Executive Committee to get approval, retain a copy of the minutes approving the acceptance of a Chapter at your Post. In the State of Maine you must contact the Legion Riders Department of Maine before you can officially start a Chapter. They will guide you through the proper protocol. 207-873-3229
